- At the discretion of the Road Captain, a new rider can get credit by participating in a ride with another American Legion Rider unit, but an officer from that ALR unit must sign-off on the ride.
- The remaining two events can be supervised rides as described above or they can consist of providing volunteer support for ALR events
- The volunteer events that the rider can get credit for includes helping with setup or cleanup at any dinner or breakfast at the post, or setup/cleanup at an ALR event (biker ball, pony express, poker runs, etc).
- This must be signed off by an officer to receive credit.
- Completed form is retained with the rider application once complete.
