For 108 years, Boy Scouts of America (BSA) has helped build the future leaders of this country by combining educational activities and lifelong values with fun. To give you some idea of how our Troop exercises its mission to create responsible and productive young adults, we offer the following for your consideration:

- <u>Leadership Development</u>: We develop leaders through leadership experiences. Troop 79 is a Scout-led Troop in the model that Sir Baden-Powell devised more than a century ago. Anyone who desires it will get the opportunity to lead. We offer local and council-level leadership training and continuous mentorship to prepare scouts for any leadership role.
- <u>Basic Scouting Principles</u>: True to the Scout Law and the Scout Oath, we live by the principles and values of the BSA. We practice these with each other and while on camping adventures. A healthy respect and admiration for nature, for society, for America and for our own independence is what we gain from these principles.
- <u>High Adventure</u>: We take adventure trips. Some highlights of past outings include: a week at sea aboard a 75-foot Schooner at Florida Sea Base, a remote river canoe trip down the mighty Missouri retracing the Lewis and Clark Expedition, rim-to-rim hike through the Grand Canyon, white water rafting, snow skiing, ice climbing, hikes up 14'ers, and motor boating and sailing on Lake Pueblo. Each of these experiences is tied to enacting leadership principles, earning merit badges, or exposure to new skills.
- Rank Advancement: We ensure our Scouts work hard to earn their awards; instilling a sense of pride. At the same time, we encourage and closely track the merit badges and rank requirements of all our Scouts. Troop 79 has had great success in helping those who wish to become an Eagle Scout attain that lofty goal.
- <u>Adult Oversight and Management</u>: We expect and need a commitment from parents. As a small Troop, the involvement and mentoring from parents is integral to our experience.
