VA TO BEGIN COMPENSATION TO SICK PERSIAN GULF VETERANS

MEMO FROM CARROLL WILLIAMS, DIRECTOR, NATIONAL VETERANS AFFAIRS AND REHABILITATION COMMISSION

The Department of Veterans Affairs has published in the Federal Register a final rule on compensation payments to chronically disabled Persian Gulf veterans with undiagnosed illnesses.

regulations. Under the new Persian Gulf veterans may eligible for compensation if they have chronic disabilities resulting undiagnosed illnesses that manifest either during became

service in the Southwest Asia theater or within two years thereafter. A disability will be considered chronic if it has existed for at least six months.

A list of 13 categories of undiagnosed illnesses has included as a means of identifying the kinds of conditions for which compensation may be paid. categories are representative of the wide range of signs and symptoms most frequently noted in the first analyzed completed and 17,000 examinations of participants in VA's Persian Gulf Registry, which was established in 1992 to identify any patterns of illnesses among Gulf veterans. The 13 categories are not and other exclusive, signs and for qualify could symptoms compensation purposes.

In a letter to more than 39,000 veterans currently on the Persian Gulf Veterans Health Registry, Jesse Secretary of Veterans Brown, reopen VA will Affairs. said denied compensation previously claims and urged veterans who have not filed claims to do so if they entitled believe they are benefits.

Persian Gulf veterans or their families can contact the nearest VA regional office by calling 1-800-827-1000 for information and assistance.

Veterans or their families can also call VA's new Persian Gulf Informatio Helpline at 1-800-PGW-(1-800-749-8387)VETS information on medical care and other benefits avaiable from VA. The Helpline, which was activated February 2, is headquartered at a new Persian Gulf Information Center at VA's St Louis Regional Office and staffed by Persia Gulf War benefit specialists who are availale weekdays from 7:30 A.M. to 8:30 P.M. (CT).
