
Many of the patients arriving at Fort Lyon have only the clothes on their backs and nothing else. In many cases, patients have no money or families to offer them support, monetary, physical, emotional or moral and many will never be released from the hospital.

The purpose of the All Patients Day Activities is to provide those types of game prizes to fufill the patients' physical needs (t-shirts, socks, shorts, etc.) while entertaining the patients and also giving them a sense of dignity. Other booths set up by other veterans groups or fraternal organizations provide soft drinks, food, melons or other kinds of prizes.

Remember, the bus leaves the Post parking lot of September 10 at 8:00. It usually makes a rest stops at La Junta and shopping at a small fruit stand is a benefit thrown in and planned on for many of our members. The whole trip is very gratifying.

I am very happy to report that we have 150 members for 1995. That is 25% of our goal and we are only 15 away from 30%. Target dates for the Department of Colorado are as follows:

If we could meet each of the above dates, it would really be WONDERFUL!! We would also be able to continue our important Legion programs such as Boy's State, All Patient Activity Day at Fort Lyon, etc. But, most important is the increased numbers of our voices to tell Congress that we expect our sacrifices as veterans to be remembered and our benefits to be retained.

In the Gazette-Telegraph, Tuesday, July 19, 1994, was an article entitled, "Gulf war vets encouraged to participate in screenings." In the event you may know anyone who served in this time frame and did not get a chance to read this article, I have extracted the most important parts below. We would appreciate your passing on this information to anyone who may be need it.

"Nearly 100 veterans, civilians and their families have complained to area military health clinics of maladies they believe may have their origins in the 1991 war agains Iraq. Doctors from Fort Carson, Peterson AFB, and the Air Force Academy asked others to step forward, saying the military wants to get to the bottom of the mysterious illnesses that have plagued some gulf war vets.

Anyone who served in the war - either as a member of the armed forces or as a civilian and members of their families are eligible for an exam and treatment at their local military health clinic. It's all part of a militarywide effort begun in late June to screen and treat anyone suspecting their ailments are linked to gulf war duty. Before the Pentagon's new push to screen gulf war vets, a soldier's treatment usually stopped with the primary care doctor. But, now physicians can send confounding cases to Fitzsimons Army Regional Medical center in Aurora for a closer look by specialists. Case information will be compiled from throughout the military in hopes that patterns will become evident, giving clues to the causes of the perplexing illnesses."
