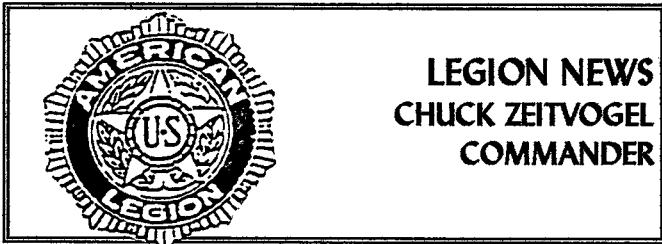


# CENTENNIAL POST 209

They will also be afforded the opportunity to register with the Veterans Administration and set appointments to get help. We are experiencing a couple of problems and you may be able to provide solutions. We are in need of men's pants in larger sizes. We are also looking for shoes/boots in sizes 10, 10½ and 11. If you have some taking up space in your closet and they are good condition, we could use them.

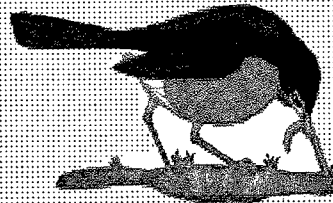

## EARLY BIRD DINNER

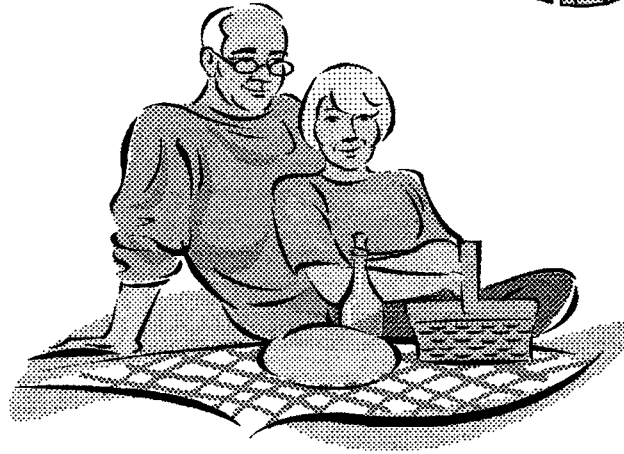
