- \* The Boys State program: This one week program is for high school seniors during which they are taught how our government works by actually setting up a government, electing officials and functioning as a government for that week. What better way to insure our future success as a dmocracy.
- \* The Oratorical Contest: Winning high school students are awarded scholarships of as much as \$25,000. They give 7-minute speeches on the Constitution.
- \* Post 209 sponsors a Cub Scout Pack. It also is involved with several Boy Scout Troops, and provides flag etiquette books for grade school students.
- \* The Post provides gas for cars of veterans who would otherwise be unable to get to doctors and hospitals for care.
- \* Post 209 helps to support the Veterans Hospital at Fort Lyon, and this year, gave out 500 pairs of shorts, shirts and socks to needy veterans, plus a cash donation of

- \$500.00 to the hospital. We also had used item donations of over \$500.00.
- \* We assist our Auxiliary at birthday parties for veterans at the Florence Nursing Home.
- \* Post 209 provides Christmas baskets for needy families.
- \* Post 209 provides food items for the VA Satellite Clinic here in Colorado Springs.
- \* We assist veterans in obtaining employment and health care.
- At the National level, the agenda of The American Legion includes lobbying Congress for:
- \* a guaranteed and adequate money source to operate VA health care services;
- \* access to medical care for all veterans, regardless of income;
- \* specialized care such as rehabilitation, prosthesis, spinal cord injury, blindness, aging, mental health and long term care;
- \* affiliation with medical schools and DOD backup;
- \* other important items such as Gulf War illnesses, Agent Orange care, prosthesis research, state VA Home programs, update of the GI Bill benefits, job training, modernization of VA facilities.

These are the more important items on the agenda of our National organization.




