



The American Legion High School Oratorical Contest

The American Legion High School Oratorical Contest is geared toward those students in grades 9 through 12. The subject of the contest is always the Constitution of The United States and as such, the students must prepare a 12 minute oration that relates to a specific subject of the Constitution.

In addition, they have to prepare 5 speeches on a list provided by National each year. At the contest, a topic is drawn and all contestants have to speak on that topic.

The contestants cannot use any notes, do not have a podium to lean on and do not have a microphone to amplify their voice. They are judged on how well they know the Constitution, the Amendments and how well they can relate the Constitution to today's world. They are also judged on their dress, their mannerisms, how well they project their voice and few other things.

This year the Department Contest will be held on 4 January 2014. The top prizes at National are scholarships to continue their education and range from \$12,000 to \$18,000 for the top 4 winners.

Colorado Veterans Day Parade 2013 The Spirit of the Warrior – Honoring our Wounded Warriors

While New York City hosts the biggest Veterans Day parade, our small corner of America participates year after year in one of the biggest home town style Veterans Day parades in the nation. Our local population's enthusiasm about Veterans Day almost goes without saying with five military installations in close proximity to the Springs and thousands of Veterans who have called this town home since retiring or separating from the military. Before I go much further, I would like to add a little history on this event. Veteran's Day originally began as Armistice Day when it was proclaimed in 1919 as a holiday by our 28th President, Woodrow Wilson. It was a day to mark the end of *the war to end all wars*. It is recognized on 11 November (11/11/1918) because it was the 11th day of the 11th month at the 11th hour that marked the cessation of the hostilities associated with WWI.

This year, November 9th turned out to be one of the most beautiful fall days in Southern Colorado and the local population turned out en masse to honor their Veterans. The theme for this year's Veterans Day Parade was "The Spirit of the Warrior – Honoring Our Wounded Warriors." The parade route started at Tejon Street and St. Vrain Street, and stretched seven city blocks to Vermijo Avenue. This doesn't sound all that big until you consider that almost each cross street was filled with participants a block deep on both sides of the parade route, making the combined length of the procession nearly 19 blocks. The past, present, and future were on display as retired organizations, active duty military, ROTC, JROTC, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, and Cub Scouts marched or participated in one of the many moving displays.

There were 96 singular and combined participating organizations in this year's line-up. The local American Legion organizations were participants 74 through 80 and were combined into one large contingency led by District Seven (and Post 209) Commander Jay Bowen. Arranged from the earliest to the latest chartered Posts, the American Legion was represented in a manner that reflected a smaller scale of our national size. The procession started with members of Cub Scout troops 24 and 386, and the American Legion Honor Guard displaying the American Flag and American Legion banner, and ended with the Honor Flight of Southern Colorado and American Legion Riders. As a whole, the procession of American Legion and Cub Scout participants stretched over a block in length.

While I had a great time being a part of last year's parade, it was incredible to move through the streets to get my pictures (see our Facebook page for photos) and hear people in the crowd thank those participating for their service. There was a true sense of camaraderie as I watched strangers exchange stories of their military background and thank those in uniform in the crowd. Organizations often refer to themselves as a family. This was one of those moments where I witnessed a town as a family. They could have been anywhere on this warm sunny weekend, but they chose to gather up the family and make the effort to find scarce parking so they could honor those of the past and present who have served this country.

Through the centuries the term's connotation has changed somewhat. Today, the *Bluejacket Manual* defines "carry on" as an order to resume work: work not so grueling as two centuries ago.

The department staff will verify that the member's dues have been posted in the computer and will then turn the application over to the membership team.

The membership team will then enter the name of the recruiter into the drawing. The new members name will also be entered. After the new member's information is verified, the new member will also be eligible to enter the contest.

You may enter as many times as you wish. For each new member you will get one chance in the drawing.

The drawing will take place on the May 2014 target date and will be conducted by the membership team.
