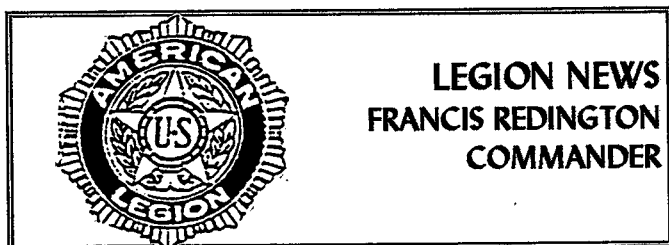


# CENTENNIAL POST 209

The New Year 2001 is upon US. WE have made positive progress with OUR property and are making progress toward getting OUR bingo game back. Much of OUR ability to hold Bingo will be dependent upon how many members WE can depend on to assist US. The reason WE surrendered OUR raffle license was due to many clerical errors created by a shortage of workers. Three or four people were trying to keep the paperwork in an orderly fashion, an almost impossible task due to lack of knowledge about the many forms we are required to have available for inspectors from the Secretary of State's office. Four or five workers cannot properly conduct the game. Therefore, if we can get about 30 people on a rotating basis to assist, a member would only be required to assist at one bingo session each month. It takes between 4 and 5 hours per event. Without bingo, WE will have to find another source of revenue, as what WE have now will not last forever. So please consider the mailing about support for bingo carefully as it is a major way to raise funds for OUR Post projects. PLEASE help US to start off the New Year on a positive note.
