From The Desk Of our Finance Officer

The last couple of months the Post has experienced a bit of a challenge with our Colorado Springs Utilities (CSU) bill. It turns out there was a leak in a condenser pipe that went unnoticed for several months, largely due to the Post being shut down from COVID. This leak caused the Post water usage to slowly creep up until January when the pipe broke. Because of being on budget billing, the impact was not known until April/May billing cycle when the large bill was sent that adjusted the monthly amount. With this adjustment, there was a large payment required to bring the account current. While it was not an ideal situation, we had no problem covering the amount due (though I am pretty sure the checking account did cry a little). As a result of this situation, I implemented a process to track the actual usage amounts on the CSU bill statements. This process will provide the ability to see anomalies in usage much quicker so that we can resolve any problems right away. I expect to see the monthly budget billing amount to go back down once we have enough billing cycles to show the usage has gone down and is staying down.

There will be an audit conducted soon for the period of March 2021 through June 2021. Once the audit is complete, the Executive Committee has approved restructuring the accounts, which will allow for a more streamlined approach to maintaining the Post finances and reduce the number of accounts to track. The goal is to reduce the number of account-to-account transfers, simplify account and expenditure tracking, and reduce the amount of time/effort necessary to maintain/reconcile the accounts.

The number of people coming out to the Post for Friday night dinners and the General Membership meetings is growing. I hope to see that trend increase since the Friday dinners and breakfast before the General Membership meetings help fund the Post; which in turn allows the Post to continue helping Veterans and their families. It is great to keep meeting more of the Post members at the door on Friday nights for dinner and at breakfast before the General Membership meeting, I would like to meet even more of you so please come out to the Post so that not only can we meet, but so you can meet and get to know the other members from your Post.

I want to thank all of the Post 209 members that have provided feedback regarding the ease of understanding the Monthly Finance Report. It is great to know I am conveying information about the Post finances in a manner than you are able to easily understand. I am always open to feedback about what information is contained in the report and recommendations on what additional information could be added to it. If you should have any questions, please feel free to reach out to me any time at: finance@legion209.org

As I stated in previous newsletters (and will keep stating), the Post needs your help in identifying new fundraising ideas. Any fundraising idea – big, small, unconventional – is worth consideration. We need to do everything possible to help the Post get back to pre-COVID and keep supporting our Veterans in the community.

From Our Post Chaplain

WHERE WAS GOD?

Think you have troubles? I just finished reading the Book of Job. You know the story: Job was a *righteous* man with wealth and a large family, living the *good* life. Then it happened. Job lost everything: his property, his family, his friends, even his health. Why do bad things happen to good people? Job didn't understand.

New Braunfels, Texas (1998). In October, a hurricane stalled off the coast of Mexico, sending heavy rains over South Texas. New Braunfels received 22 inches of rain in a 24-hour period, causing the Guadalupe and Comal rivers to rise 19 feet above flood level. I saw a house floating down the river. I volunteered at a Red Cross shelter at a local church.

I arrived for my first full day and discovered one box of eight stale donuts. I surveyed the 80 people sleeping on Army cots. The rich and the poor had lost everything. The flood had made equals of us all. "Wurstfest", an annual "salute to sausage" that brings in over 100,000 people and millions of dollars to the community, was two weeks away. The festival buildings and grounds were filled with uprooted trees, branches, and debris. Some wondered, "God, why?"

I had a different question. I was a shepherd. I stepped out on the front porch of the shelter in the morning light. "Lord", I asked, "how will I feed them?"

Moore, Oklahoma (2013) An EF-5 tornado hit Moore, Oklahoma with a power 8 times greater than the atomic bomb that hit Hiroshima. Three hundred homes were demolished, and an elementary school was hit. Twenty-four townspeople were killed, including 6 children.

Do you know what it is like to lose your only son? God knows. It is normal for one in a traumatic event to express shock, anger and hurt. God knows.

Televangelist Robert Schuller used to say, "Tough times never last; tough people DO!"

Job, ever faithful, would get everything back he lost, and more.

Moments after my front porch question to the Lord, a kitchen truck drove up to the church. "Hi!", the driver said, "We're the Salvation Army, and we're looking for a mission!"

They fed men, women, and children three hot meals a day. Meanwhile, the people of New Braunfels rallied. We weren't "citizens" anymore – we were *neighbors*. Survivors worked to move debris and restore the festival grounds. "Wurstfest" opened on schedule; two weeks after the Great (500 year) Flood. The city healed.

Volunteers helped the people of Moore, Oklahoma to rebuild homes, churches, and the elementary school. A local artist created a sculpture from debris to honor those perished, and to remember the spirit of the survivors. Where was God? He was right there, all along.

Remember Job and "keep the faith." There may come a time in life when God is <u>all you have</u> – that's when you find that God is all you need. (Proverbs 3:5)

Buy A Brick Fundraiser!

We are re-introducing an exciting fundraiser for our Post. We are partnering with Polar Engraving to offer our members, family, friends, and our corporate Veteran-friendly supporters an opportunity to purchase an engraved brick to adorn our landscaping project we are working. The engraving uses the same technology as used on tombstones so it's extremely durable. Here are some FAQs:

- What Are We Having? A Brick Fundraising Event
- Why? To Further Funding of our American Legion Programs
- What Size Are the Bricks? 4"x 8" or 8"x 8" bricks for individuals, and 8"x 8" or 12"x 12" bricks for our corporate supporters.
- What are the Costs for the Individual Bricks? Prices vary depending on size, styre and returning desired, but typically range from \$75 to \$200. For the 8x8 or 12x12 bricks, you can add a second emblem. Contact the Adjutant for ordering details. There is **NO** additional cost for the second emblem on the larger bricks.
- What are the Costs for the Corporate/Veteran Supporter Bricks? Again, prices vary depending on size, style, and lettering but typically range from \$125 to \$500.
- What is the Difference between Individual and Corporate Bricks? Individual bricks are identified for Veterans, and family members of Veterans wishing to purchase a brick to honor their Veteran. The corporate bricks are for our Veteran-friendly supporters and businesses who wish to show their continued support to our Nation's heroes by purchasing a brick.
- Is the Brick Purchase Restricted to Members of the Post 209 Family? No. We encourage members to buy a brick for themselves as a lasting memory of their association with Post 209. We also welcome anyone to purchase a brick for their Veteran loved one, or to show their support to our Veterans.
- Can I Buy a 12"x 12" Brick for Myself/Loved One? Absolutely!
- Where Do I Go to Buy a Brick? We have a link on our website. Just visit legion209.org and click on "Walk of Honor." Or, you can visit http://polarengraving.com/ALPost209 to buy your brick. The site is very user-friendly and will walk you through the design and purchase. You will be able to see a preview of your brick before finalizing the purchase.
- How Do I Pay For the Brick? We have the site setup to accept payment via PayPal or by check. PayPal is an extremely safe way to purchase a brick and you don't need a PayPal account to use it.
- Where Will the Brick Be Shipped? All bricks will be shipped to the Post. We will notify you when it arrives and you are welcome to stop by and see the brick you have purchased.
- What Will Become of My Brick? It will be placed near the Flagpole at the Post and will be part of the landscaping design we are working. If you are a landscaper or know a good one (preferably a Veteran), have them contact our Adjutant.
- How Long Will this Fundraiser Effort Last? We plan to only sell as many bricks as needed for the first phase of the landscaping project. Currently, that is anticipated to be 600 bricks, but that number may change depending on brick sizes purchased and the final design approved by the Post.
- Will I Have an Opportunity to Buy a Brick Later? Quite possibly. It depends on what is decided/approved for the next phase of our project.

Order your brick(s) now to ensure you get one in Phase One of our project. If you buy multiple bricks, let our Adjutant know and we will make certain they are all placed together.



Bringing A Little South to the West



Unless you lived on a farm where your nearest neighbor was 5 miles away and you were homeschooled, you probably grew up having to deal with neighborhood bullies. It didn't matter where you grew up, whether it was in an urban environment, a suburb, or out in the rural countryside, bullies abound.

The interesting thing I learned about bullies was that regardless where they lived and operated, they seemed to be bullies only when surrounded by their buds. You get with them alone and by and large they were just normal, everyday people. But apparently, there is something about getting a bully together with others like them; that's when they transform from Dr. Jekyll into Mr. Hyde.

We had a few in my neighborhood growing up. Matter of fact, one of the more notorious bullies lived right next door. He was a year older than me and had a brother my age. He, his brother, my brother (Bubba), and I were pretty good friends until the next-door neighbors got together with their "gang." Then it was as if they were completely different persons.

I remember on one occasion I had just returned from a dentist visit and had a couple of temporary fillings put in some molars that had cavities. The Dentist had given me strict instructions to be very careful over the next few days with my food intake. That afternoon as I was leaving school and making my way through a park near the school, the "gang" approached. One of their members, a guy I had known for several years walked up and began shouting at me about some alleged infraction. I explained I wasn't the guilty party, but it was obvious my opinion didn't count. He started swinging. Fortunately for me he wasn't very good nor strong. He reminded me of the short dude who was the sidekick of the bully in the movie, "A Christmas Story." He was the toad. I was able to easily block most of his blows at my face and didn't try to fight back. I also learned that if you were to get the advantage over one, you wound up having to fight them all.

The next day I confronted the guy in the hallway at school. He was very apologetic and wanted to be friends. He acted as if he was almost frightened of what I was going to do. There were no "gang" members around to give him support or protection.

For those who believe in karma, I got my revenge. A few years later, he and I were on a Golden Gloves team sponsored by the Memphis Police Department. Several evenings we trained and sparred against each other. He and I were in the same weight class so it was inevitable we would spar at some point. When it happened, I beat him to a pulp. It felt pretty good, and it was legal.

There were other bullies in my neighborhood from elementary all the way up through high school. Most of them were friends and when they were not with their "gang," we hung out together. If you had met them when they were alone, you would have probably liked them. And because I hung out with them when they were Dr. Jekyll, I was pretty much ignored most of the time when they morphed into Mr. Hyde.

I thought the days of bullies would end when I became an adult. How naïve I was to think that. There are bullies everywhere today. I'm not talking about gangs like the crips and the bloods. I am talking about people we interact with at work and in our extra-curricular activities such as The American Legion. It's interesting to note the one constant about a bully even today; they act totally different when confronted one-on-one. But get them together with their "gang," and you see a different personality. You can see it in their email messages, their Facebook Posts, and even in conferences and meetings when they are with their support group of other "group think" bullies. But get them to sit down across the table with you individually, and they are as friendly as a puppy.
