September Our annual trip to Fort Lyon will be on September 11th. We will have a booth again this year. If you have not made this trip, you have missed one of the highlights of the year. Our main goal is to help veterans in need and this is helping the most needy veterans.

October October 30 will be the Harvest Ball and Halloween Costume Party. We will have a band and awards will be made for the best costume.

November There are no planned activities for November.

December This year we will have two Christmas parties. December 11th will be the annual Children's Christmas Party. The children's party will run from 1:00 P.M. to 3:00 P.M. on the 11th and the adult's dinner party and gift exchange will start at 7:00 P.M. on December 18th. The gift exchange will be limited to \$5.00 per gift, marked male or female.

December/January There will be a New Year's Eve Party and dance. Breakfast will be served about 1:00 A.M. Toast the New Year.

ADJUTANT ANNOTATIONS - Ann Foster

It is hard to believe that we are off and running on our 1994 Membership Drive. The new Legion year started 1 July 93 and we are already over 10% of goal. Keep the renewals coming in at that rate and we will get more awards than we did this year.

Speaking of awards, we brought home several thanks to the efforts of many of our members. We received a 100% membership ribbon for our flag, a plaque for All Time High Goal Post 1993 and a plaque for 32K Award 126.78% plus the individual awards of jackets and T-shirts.

As Commander Bufkin mentioned, we will likely have an increase in dues due to rising postal and paper costs and decreasing interest rates. National Convention delegates will be voting on an increase in September. Since there has not been an increase in dues in eleven years, it is probable that it will pass.

At this time, Colorado Permanent Membership rates are \$130 for 65 and over and based on our current dues, the rate is \$310 for those under 65. Should the Permanent Membership committee decide to leave the rate chart as is and we raise dues to \$25.00 in January 1994, the rate for those under 65 could be \$372.50. A savings of \$62.50 could be realized by purchasing a Permanent Membership before 31 December 93. For those who would like to make payments, we will keep a record and send in the application as soon as payment is complete. A Permanent Membership includes all per capita fees, administration fee, membership card and permanent membership cap pin. You could avoid ever having to pay dues again!

I concur with Commander Bufkin's assessment of the success

of Department Convention. I particularly enjoyed hearing the Department Oratorical Contest winner and also the thoughts of Boy's State and Girl's State Governors. We really need to support these programs. They are our future and need all the help they can get.

After the mailing of the last newsletter, we were charged \$1.74 postage for those members who moved and did not tell us. This may not seem like much, but it does mount up. PLEASE REMEMBER TO INCLUDE US WHEN YOU SEND OUT YOUR CHANGE OF ADDRESS! We need to be responsible stewards of your money and need your help in doing that.
