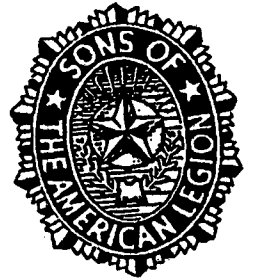

FROM THE COMMANDER - HARRY JOHNSON

The Department Convention was held on July 22 to 25 at Sterling, Colorado and Post 209 had six members in attendance. The meeting covered a wide range of topics which were very informative. The new Department Commander is Ed Wearing. Jack Tarpey, of Post 38 in Security, was elected Sr Vice Commander.

Our annual trip to Fort Lyon will be September 9. We will leave the Post Home at 7:30 A.M. and return about 8:30 P.M. This is one of the highlights of the year, and our opportunity to help our comrades in need who are unable to provide for themselves. If you have not cleaned your closets yet this year, now is the time to do it. Bring any useable item of clothing to one of our meetings, to the Post Home, or call me and we will arrange to pick it up. The need is great for any items...pants, shorts, shoes, etc. Last year your Post gave 150 sets of T-shirts, shorts and socks at a cost of \$500.00, \$500.00 in cash to the general fund, and about \$1500.00 of useable items to Fort Lyon.

Boys State was just completed last

week and your Post sponsored 10 boys at a cost of \$2180.00. They joined about 300 other boys for the four day program which develops leadership and instills a sense of pride in the American way of life, provides a structured course of study in the complicated governmental process of city, county, state government - election and voting procedures, and provides the knowledge that American democracy and freedom are priceless achievements.

American Legion baseball has started for the summer, and your Post is sponsoring a team. This year we purchased new uniforms at a cost of about \$400.00 and paid the sponsor fee of about \$600.00. This helps youth to learn sportsmanship and teamwork in place of learning about drugs and guns.

Our annual picnic will be held in August and the committee is working on a site and planning the event. More in next month's newsletter.

follows would be affected:

1. Freeze funding for the VA health care system at the 1995 level for the next seven years;
2. Totally phase out construction of new VA facilities by 1999.
3. Freeze VA's general operating expense budget at the 1995 level for the next seven years.
4. Redefine disability for compensation purposes to cover much smaller groups of conditions and grant service connection for only those disabilities which are directly caused by the performance of military duties.
5. Phase in higher prescription co-payments for Veterans.
6. Extend cost-saving provisions in current law which are due to expire.
7. Increase the amount the service member must contribute to the program for the Montgomery GI bill.

There are other provisions, but this gives you some idea of the drastic cuts planned. You will find in the newsletter the names and addresses of your congressional representa-

Remember, you make the difference as a member, in supporting your American Legion Post and your community, because you care.

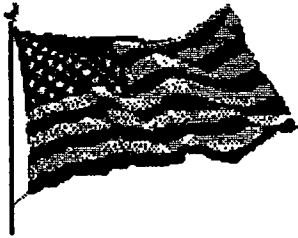
ADJUTANT ANNOTATIONS - ANN FOSTER


