But, importantly at this time, it is helping the Department of Colorado in its membership goal of becoming number one in the nation. It is now in second place so we need to keep on recruiting and reminding those who have not renewed to do so. Many thanks go to all who have helped to make this a wonderful year for membership.

The District 7 Convention at Post 38 on 2 May was very impressive. Elections were held for officers to serve in the coming Legion year. Our Commander, Floyd Bufkin, was elected to serve as District Junior Vice Commander. Larry Johnson was appointed as Adjutant. I was elected as an alternate delegate to National Convention which will be 3 - 9 September in Pittsburgh, Penn. Thus, our post is well represented. District events are an excellent way to get better acquainted with fellow Legionnaires so watch the calendar for upcoming events at this level.

The Installation Banquet on 22 May was excellent. Our own June Thomas, Department Senior Vice Commander, installed both the Auxiliary and Legion officers. We think that may be a first!

The presentation of awards followed installation. Many of those who have helped throughout the past year were recognized for their support to The American Legion. Those who were not present will be contacted to arrange for receipt of their awards.

During June, we look forward to the project with the Kellogg Company. We will distribute coupons at King Soopers which will subsequently raise money for the Retinitis Pigmentosa Foundation and The American Legion Child Welfare Foundation.

Boys State will be 13 - 18 June at Pueblo. We are sending nine young men to learn more about how our government works.

The Post is planning to schedule a flag-burning ceremony, date to be determined. Please bring into the Post any flags which need to be properly destroyed.

Department Convention will be 24 - 27 June in Estes Park, and we will be excited about seeing June Thomas installed as the first female Commander in the Department of Colorado.

Sid Terry from Task Force Omega of Colorado announces the schedule of ceremonies for the month of June; June 4 for Burke H. Morgan and June 19 for Thomas M. Hanratty. These begin at 6:00 P.M. at the War Memorial in Memorial Park.

Task Force Omega will also be at Walsenburg on June 5 for the

parade, Ft Collins June 13 for a POW/MIA poker run and at Good Shepard Church in Fountain briefing a youth group on June 13.

He has received acknowledgement from Robert M. Isaac, Mayor of the City of Colorado Springs, of the request that the POW/MIA flag be flown outside the City Administration Building during POW/MIA week, September 12-18. Mayor Isaacs will issue a proclamation.

Terry, Chairman for Task Force Omega of Colorado, states that the POW/MIA flag flies over the State Capitol building in Denver permanently.
