Because he will always be there to help you through the changes and suggest others in the event the one you just made didn't work out. Oh, and the suggestions really aren't; they're going to happen anyway. He just wants you to think you have some control. That's the warped part.

I've been very fortunate in my life that for the most part, the changes which occurred have been better for my family, myself, and for most of those in my inner circle. It's not because I analyzed the change and calculated the move; it's because I trusted in God to always lead the way. He gets the credit, I just go along for the ride. And what a ride. There's also the part of my makeup that will not accept failure, so any decision I make regarding my life works out because I won't allow it not to. I adjust on the fly to make it work. Again, that's His work in me, not anything I do on my own. I guess my message to you this month is don't fret over changes. Embrace them. You may as well because it's going to happen anyway. By the way, this is not the article I planned to write this month.

## D Day 70th Anniversary: A Look Back By Historian Rob Johnson

During World War II (1939-1945), the Battle of Normandy, which lasted from June 1944 to August 1944, resulted in the Allied liberation of Western Europe from Nazi Germany's control. Codenamed Operation Overlord, the battle began on June 6, 1944, also known as D-Day, when some 156,000 American, British and Canadian forces landed on five beaches along a 50-mile stretch of the heavily fortified coast of France's Normandy region. The invasion was one of the largest amphibious military assaults in history and required extensive planning. Prior to D-Day, the Allies conducted a large-scale deception campaign designed to mislead the Germans about the intended invasion target. By late August 1944, all of northern France had been liberated, and by the following spring the Allies had defeated the Germans. The Normandy landings have been called the beginning of the end of war in Europe.

General Dwight D. Eisenhower called the operation a crusade in which "we will accept nothing less than full victory." More than 5,000 ships and 11,000 aircraft supported the invasion, and by day's end, the Allies gained a foot-hold in France. The D-Day cost was high with more than 9,000 Allied soldiers killed or wounded as they marched across Europe to defeat Hitler began.

### Independence Day

On July 2nd, the Continental Congress voted in favor of independence, and two days later delegates adopted the Declaration of Independence, an historic document drafted by Thomas Jefferson.

From 1776 until the present day, July 4th has been celebrated as the birth of American independence, with typical festivities ranging from fireworks, parades and concerts to more casual family gatherings and barbecues.
