"A LITTLE POST GOING PLACES AND DOING BIG THINGS"

March, 1992

On March 15, 1992, the American Legion will begin its 74th year of service to the nation's veterans, widows and orphans, as well as service to the community, state and nation.

Taking you back to February 1919, twenty soldiers from the Army Expeditionary Force (AEF), met over dinner and considered steps which would improve conditions and morale for the 2.5 million soldiers and sailors who had fought a war and were tired of discipline, regulations and being away from home. One of the participants, LTC Theodore Roosevelt, Jr., proposed that an Association of American Veterans of the War be organized.

It was decided that all those who served in American uniform overseas and at home should be included; that it should be a civilian organization, devoid of rank; and that it must operate in democratic fashion.

Two organizational meetings were held, one in Paris, France and one in the United States. Committees were formed who gave us a Preamble, an official name and on September 15, 1919, the United States Congress passed an act incorporating The American Legion. From the beginning, The American

Legion was concerned with caring for disabled veterans, widows and orphans and encouraged government to provide adequate hospitalization, rehabilitation, employment programs and disability payments.

The American Legion's greatest single piece of legislative achievement was the Serviceman's Readjustment Act of 1944...the GI Bill. It was signed by President Roosevelt on June 22, 1944.

Over the years, The American Legion has been involved with community, veterans' affairs and a host of other programs such as Legion baseball (70 years), Boys State (39th year), and The American Legion High School Oratorical Contest (since 1938).

More recently, during Desert Shield and Desert Storm, the American Legion instituted a family hotline to assist the families of military personnel in the Gulf. To date, the American Legion has answered in excess of 20,000 calls for assistance.

The American Legion has had an impressive first 74 years and it is only through the work and dedication of each and everyone of us that The American Legion will have another glorious 74 years.

ORATORICAL

They are then judged and given five minutes to prepare a speech, not to exceed three minutes, on a subject which is given to them at that time. They are then judged on that speech and scores are totaled to determine a winner. Contestants are not permitted to use notes or prompts and are judged on content, voice and delivery.

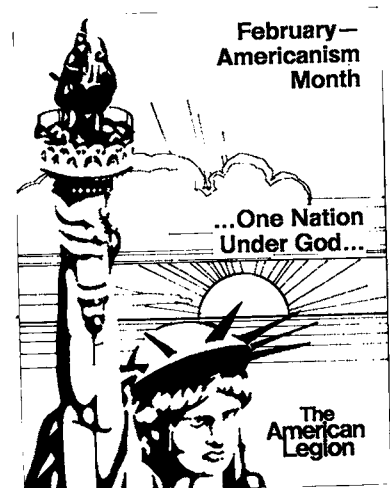
March 7 is the Legion Birthday Dinner. We of the Auxiliary will present the Legion with a birthday cake.
