## LEGION NEWS

Plans for the proposed Post Home were presented at the membership meeting on February 15. The building will be two levels, with the lower level being a Bingo hall, seating 250-300 people, and with separate parking and entrance for players. The total structure will be 7500 sq. ft. The upper level will include office space for the business of the Post, as well as a dining room, a ballroom, meeting rooms and a lounge and bar area. With folding walls, the ballroom, dining room and meeting rooms can be opened up to form a very large room, if needed. We will have the plans at the March meeting. No potluck will be held at this meeting as the American Legion Birthday Party will be March 23. 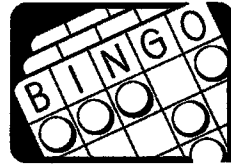
Executive Board Meetings for both Legion and Auxiliary will be on March 6 at the office of the Post.
