I hope this email finds you doing well! We have an all volunteer non-profit, VAU Veterans and Athletes United, and we are looking for veterans interested in helping to travel our War on Terror Memorial dog tag flag.

We completed a fallen heroes memorial in 2018 which is a large 28' wide by 6' tall American Flag designed out of all the dog tags of those who have fallen in the war on terror. More details on the memorial can be found at www.vetsau.com/memorial <<u>http://www.vetsau.com/memorial</u>>. It travels to many locations nationwide.

We are based out of Richmond Virginia and right now we are only capable of travelling to host locations East of the Mississippi. We receive numerous applications for the memorial flag west of the Mississippi to include San Diego, New Mexico and many other locations. We are currently looking into building a second rendition of this memorial flag to keep out West and travel to the many Locations where we receive requests. We think that once we designate a couple travel coordinators out West that we could potentially have the memorial flag built within the next 8 months to possibly travel by 2022.

We are currently looking for veterans with a flexible schedule that live out West that may be interested in honoring our fallen service members from GWOT. Responsibilities include travel to great locations and events to set up and break down the VAU dog tag memorial flag (possiby twice a month). And coordinating future events to display the flag. All travel, lodging and meals are covered. We may be able to include a possible stipend for each trip based on donations we receive.

There were 16 recommendations made at the end of the audit, of which 13 have already been implemented with the other 3 being considered and/or are in progress.

Buy A Brick Fundraiser!

We are re-introducing an exciting fundraiser for our Post. We are partnering with Polar Engraving to offer our members, family, friends, and our corporate Veteran-friendly supporters an opportunity to purchase an engraved brick to adorn our landscaping project we are working. The engraving uses the same technology as used on tombstones so it's extremely durable. Here are some FAQs:

- What Are We Having? A Brick Fundraising Event
- Why? To Further Funding of our American Legion Programs
- What Size Are the Bricks? 4"x 8" or 8"x 8" bricks for individuals, and 8"x 8" or 12"x 12" bricks for our corporate supporters.
- What are the Costs for the Individual Bricks? Prices vary depending on size, style and retering desired, but typically range from \$75 to \$200. For the 8x8 or 12x12 bricks, you can add a second emblem. Contact the Adjutant for ordering details. There is <u>NO</u> additional cost for the second emblem on the larger bricks.
- What are the Costs for the Corporate/Veteran Supporter Bricks? Again, prices vary depending on size, style, and lettering but typically range from \$125 to \$500.
- What is the Difference between Individual and Corporate Bricks? Individual bricks are identified for Veterans, and family members of Veterans wishing to purchase a brick to honor their Veteran. The corporate bricks are for our Veteran-friendly supporters and businesses who wish to show their continued support to our Nation's heroes by purchasing a brick.
- Is the Brick Purchase Restricted to Members of the Post 209 Family? No. We encourage members to buy a brick for themselves as a lasting memory of their association with Post 209. We also welcome anyone to purchase a brick for their Veteran loved one, or to show their support to our Veterans.
- Can I Buy a 12"x 12" Brick for Myself/Loved One? Absolutely!
- Where Do I Go to Buy a Brick? We have a link on our website. Just visit legion209.org and click on "Walk of Honor." Or, you can visit <u>http://polarengraving.com/ALPost209</u> to buy your brick. The site is very user-friendly and will walk you through the design and purchase. You will be able to see a preview of your brick before finalizing the purchase.
- How Do I Pay For the Brick? We have the site setup to accept payment via PayPal or by check. PayPal is an extremely safe way to purchase a brick and you don't need a PayPal account to use it.
- Where Will the Brick Be Shipped? All bricks will be shipped to the Post. We will notify you when it arrives and you are welcome to stop by and see the brick you have purchased.
- What Will Become of My Brick? It will be placed near the Flagpole at the Post and will be part of the landscaping design we are working. If you are a landscaper or know a good one (preferably a Veteran), have them contact our Adjutant.
- How Long Will this Fundraiser Effort Last? We plan to only sell as many bricks as needed for the first phase of the landscaping project. Currently, that is anticipated to be 600 bricks, but that number may change depending on brick sizes purchased and the final design approved by the Post.
- Will I Have an Opportunity to Buy a Brick Later? Quite possibly. It depends on what is decided/approved for the next phase of our project.

Order your brick(s) now to ensure you get one in Phase One of our project. If you buy multiple bricks, let our Adjutant know and we will make certain they are all placed together.



BRINGING A LITTLE SOUTH TO THE WEST



What is it about kids and noise? Regardless of age, there has always appeared to be a direct correlation between a kid and loud noise. The louder, the better it seems.

Babies seem to love hearing themselves scream, especially at a Department Store or Restaurant. And because many parents don't discipline kids these days, the caterwauling goes on and on.

As they get older, the noise continues, but with a different slant. I remember buying the Topps Bubble Gum and Baseball trading cards for a nickel. The gum in the packet wasn't very good, but it served a purpose. It was very thin and ran along the front of the prize; the Baseball card. No one I knew bought the gum for the bubble gum, they bought it to get the Baseball cards.

My buddies and I weren't big Baseball fans, but we knew the value of the cards. It wasn't for collecting or trading, it was to put in the spokes of your bicycle to make it sound like a motorcycle. We'd take a couple of Mom's wooden spring-loaded clothes pins and pinch the pin around the front frame of the bicycle with a Baseball card so that it just slightly touched the spokes. Then as we'd ride, the spokes would cause the card to flap in a rhythm that sounded a lot like a motorcycle. The faster we went, the more it would roar. And if we really wanted to make some noise, we'd put another card on the other side of the frame or on the back wheel frame and make it sound like a large motorcycle. But you'd have to place the cards just right or the spokes would just pull them off the clothes pin.

And speaking of those spring-loaded clothes pins, they made great raw pea and/or corn shooters. We'd take the pins apart, invert one side, tape the back end of the pin, take the spring out and invert it so the coil hung down like a trigger, slightly notch the back curve in the bottom pin, and Voila! You have a pea shooter. You'd need a plunger to push the spring back into the notch, so we'd normally take apart another clothes pin and use one of the two sticks as our plunger.

But I digress. This article isn't about making weapons of mass destruction, it is about making noise.
