On Memorial Day, May 25, 1992, we will take time to remember those loved ones, friends and acquaintances to whom we are close. In addition, it is the time to remember those who gave so much of themselves.

At Memorial Park, at 11:00 A.M., there will be services to honor those men and women who gave so much for us to maintain what we have today.

All veterans and their families are invited to attend this ceremony sponsored by the Pikes Peak Veterans Council and DAV Chapter 26.

Following the services, Open Houses will be held at VFW Post 4051, TREA Chapter 1 and DAV Chapter 26.

At 1:00 P.M., the senior ground forces commander in Desert Storm will uniquely honor all U. S. military personnel who participated in the Persian Gulf war.

Lt. General Calvin A. H. Waller and U. S. Senator Hank Brown will dedicate a bronze memorial to the Desert Storm armed forces during a colorful military ceremony at the Veterans Honor Court of the Shrine

of Remembrance Mausoleum.

The public is invited to the ceremony on Monday, May 25, at 1:00 P.M. at 1730 East Fountain Blvd.

General Waller was selected to be the Deputy Commander-in-Chief of the allied forces deployed to the Persian Gulf with headquarters in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia. He was second in command of the Persian Gulf allied forces and coordinator of the ground campaign plan.

General Waller and Senator Brown will unveil the large bronze plaque at the traditional Memorial Day program. The plaque is a focal point of the Veterans Honor Court at the mausoleum. The ceremony will be similar to the military pageantry usually seen only at the grave of the unknown soldier at Arlington National Cemetery near Washington, D.C.

Military Honor guards and a cannon salute with a wreath-laying ceremony is included in the program with units from Ft Carson and Peterson Air Force Base and the Ft Carson Division Band.

The famed Colorado Springs Chorale will provide a patriotic music program, including the song "America the Beautiful" written in Colorado Springs 99 years ago.
