

It is 11 April, and we have 266 Legionnaires for 2003. Our goal is 292 Legionnaires for 100% and we are 26 members away from the goal of 292 Legionnaires. We are trying to reach a goal of 311 Legionnaires which when then put us at 110% of membership.

I know you are probably thinking why is this still so important know. First, we only have until 14 May 2003 to reach this goal and for recognitions that come with this membership attainment goal by the Department of Colorado.

Comrade Legionnaires:

Today we are facing a crisis in the continued existence of this American Legion Post.

Over the 27 years we have gone from a novel, new, unknown Post to one of the most recognized Post's within the western region of The United States.

Over the years I have personally served with, recruited and helped to serve the needs of others with many of you. I can recall when I first joined in 1977 there were many senior members who were actively employed and unable to assist with Post projects. Furthermore, there were many others who joined who were also unable to get involved due to employment. Nevertheless, all wanted to be Legionnaires and paid their dues regularly over the years. Today, this situation has changed for many of us and we need your help. Many of us are now retired and available to assist.

Today, we are a far cry from the little Post of 1976 in assets. In 1976 we had assets of 32 members, \$ 58.00 in cash, and all Post physical assets were kept in one briefcase. Today, we have approximately 300 members, \$.5 million in assets and little or no cash flow. Of course, you ask, what's the problem? The problem is that we have a lack of displayed concerned and dedicated Legionnaires to fill the various positions within this Post and perform the myriad duties to maintain the Post as a viable entity.

We must have dedicated Legionnaires who are willing to devote time, energy and resources to make this Post the proud organization it once was. We have a history that is the envy of many of the small Posts in this organization. We have served this

community well in many areas including Temporary Family Assistance, Family Support Network Activity, Thanksgiving and Christmas Baskets, The American Legion Boy's State Program. The American Legion High School Oratorical Contest and summer Baseball programs. We have won many awards and have had two Department Commanders elected from our little Post along with selections to many National Boards and Councils.

We are currently at a crossroad and need the help of each and every one of you to insure that we continue on the road of service to the Community, State and Nation.

We can, with your help, rebuild the stature of this Post to one of prominence. I am fully aware that everyone can't work bingo, sell raffle tickets, or build a Post home physically. But, there is something each of us can do assist in this effort. I know that each and everyone of you "Care Enough to Make a Difference". Otherwise, why would you have signed on as a Legionnaire following the completion of your military obligation? You chose to assist your fellow veterans and their family and that need still exists today. This organization was established to provide for those who had borne the battle, were wounded, ill, widowed and orphaned. That need is ongoing today, as we fight a war in Iraq. Will we be there for them (veterans) when they return? Or, will they return to someplace where "No one Cares Enough to Care"?

Will The American Legion Post 209's Banner still be flying high to welcome them home and help them through their trials and tribulations? I hope so!!
