## FROM THE

 AGITATORAs you know, there has been a proposal by the County of El Paso to cut the El Paso County Veterans Affairs Office.

On 22 October 1991, Legionnaires from Centennial Post 209 joined with other Veterans Organizations at Centennial Hall to oppose the cut of the El Paso County Affairs Office.

During the year of 1990 the Veterans Service Office received over 24,854 calls for assistance. The office seen 6,479 Veterans and their Families in the office and conducted 22 home visits to veterans who were for some reason unable to come down to the office. They processed over 550 compensation claims as well as over 1,000 misc. claims for assistance.

If the office is forced to close as a result of these budget cuts by the County, the Veterans of El Paso County will have no recourse but to start involving the Veterans Organization in their quest for assistance.

One of the unique pieces of information is that when the Post Closures were being discussed The City of Colorado Springs as well as the County were against the cut as it would be a loss of jobs and income to the County and the City they were against it, now they want to cut the Veterans support in order to ease money problems.

All these students have to do is prepare (under their own power) a fifteen (15) minute oration that relates to the United States Constitution and a five (5) minute extemporaneous speech of one (1) out of six (6) subjects given to them during the contest. The range of competition is from students in 9 th to 12 th grades and currently enrolled in school and must be an American Citizens.

The purpose of this contest is make the student aware of the United States Constitution and what is stands for as well as to prepare the students in public speaking and presentation of their ideas.

The prizes range from Certificates and plagues to an $\$ 18,000.00$ scholarship for First place, $\$ 16,000.00$ scholarship for Second Place, \$16,000.00 scholarship for third place and \$12,000.00 scholarship for Fourth Place in the National Contest.
