FROM THE AGITATOR

As you know, there has been a
proposal by the County of El Paso
to cut the El Paso County
Veterans Affairs Office.

On 22 October 1991, Legionnaires
from Centennial Post 209 joined
with other Veterans Organizations
at Centennial Hall to oppose the
cut of the El Paso County Affairs
Office.

During the year of 1990 the
Veterans Service Office received
over 24,854 calls for assistance.
The office seen 6,479 Veterans
and their Families in the office
and conducted 22 home visits to
veterans who were for some reason
unable to come down to the
office. They processed over 550
compensation claims as well as
over 1,000 misc. claims for
assistance.

If the office is forced to close
as a result of these budget cuts
by the County, the Veterans of El
Paso County will have no recourse
but to start involving the
Veterans Organization in their
quest for assistance.

One of the unique pieces of
information is that when the Post
Closures were being discussed The
City of Colorado Springs as well
as the County were against the
cut as it would be a loss of jobs
and income to the County and the
City they were against it, now
they want to cut the Veterans
support in order to ease money
problems.

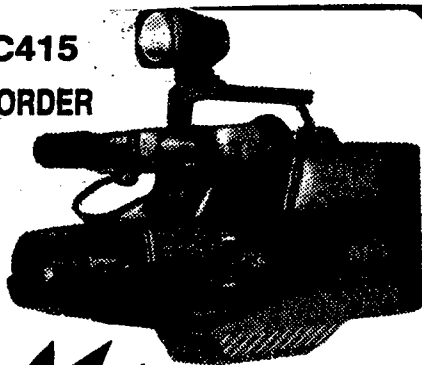
