

#### GULF SCREENINGS OFFERED

The Gazette Telegraph reports that the Pentagon has begun providing medical screenings for veterans of Persian Gulf War who 1991 developed unexplained ailments during and after the conflict. Clinics at Fort Carson, Peterson Air Force Base and the Air Force Academy scheduling appointments are civilian active duty personnel. employees and families who think their illnesses might be connected gulf duty. Initial war examinations will be conducted at If a diagnosis the local clinics. can't be provided, patients will be sent to Fitzsimmons Army Regional Medical Center for more thorough exams. The screenings are provided as part of a military-wide program to assess the nature of gulf-related illnesses and provide treatment.

SUBJECT: Perpetual Stamp for All POW/MIAs of All Wars

Hereby petition the Citizens' Stamp Advisory Committee, et al, to create and print a perpetual postage stamp in honor of the POW/MIAs from ALL wars, to be sold at first class rates for one ounce, at whatever current rates apply.

Said stamp should be made in the image of the universally recognized POW/MIA design which portrays a shield outlined in white with a black background. The letters POW/MIA are printed in white at the top of the shield with a five pointed star in between the POW and MIA. Underneath that is the white circle with the male silhouette of a bowed head and the silhouette of a guard tower in the background with a guard and weapon in place. Crossing in front of the male silhouette is a distinct piece of barbed wire and underneath is the symbolic roman olive-leaf open wreath which overrides the words "YOU ARE NOT FORGOTTEN" The symbol is pictured.
