Honor Flight of Southern Colorado (HFOSC) just completed their 4th trip with 23 WWII Veterans on September 13-15. To date, they have taken over 60 WWII Veterans to Washington DC to visit the memorials erected in their honor. The HFOSC is respon-

sible for all of Southern Colorado, 32 counties! It is not too early to start raising funds for the next trip in May of 2014. The number of WWII Veterans they are able to take is dependent on the amount of funds raised, so I would like to announce our "Veteran Sponsorship Program." They would like to get schools, businesses, military groups, churches, work places, Veterans groups, etc., involved in sponsoring a Veteran. The cost to take a Veteran is \$950. Fundraising to sponsor a Veteran would be at your discretion, however, they are happy to help by providing any marketing materials that you need as well as visits to your group by past recipients of our program.



In early 2014, they will assign their newly selected WWII Veterans to each group so that you may get more familiar with the Veteran that you are sponsoring! The class began with an overview of the course and continued with a discussion of the proper equipment and apparel that should be used for three position competitive shooting. A safety briefing was given by our Chief

Range Safety Officer, which included range safety commands and focused on SAFETY, SAFETY, and MORE **SAFETY!** The class ended with an explanation on the operation of the Air Rifle, the basic components that make up the Air Rifle and once again, SAFETY, SAFETY and MORE SAFETY! The class will continue next week with aiming and trigger control, then shooting from the Bench Rest position.


