The first is THE GOLD BRIGADE AWARD which is awarded to each recruiter who signs up fifty or more new members before March 31, 1992. This award consists of a gold jacket, a gold baseball cap with a Gold Brigade emblem sewn on, and a Certificate of Appreciation as well as a chance of a grand prize that will be drawn at the National Membership workshop in July of 1992.
