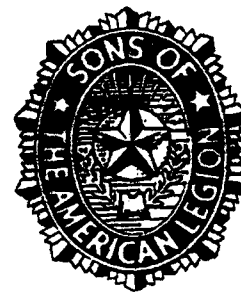

If everyone signed up at least two members, we could easily accomplish our goals.

New member recruiting is sluggish with only 16 signed up thus far.

Earlier, I said that membership is the lifeblood of The American Legion because without members we cannot accomplish our mission as stated in the Preamble to the Constitution quoted as follows: "For God and Country, we associate ourselves together for the following purposes: To uphold and defend the Constitution of the United States of America; To maintain law and order; To foster and perpetuate a one hundred percent Americanism; To preserve the memories and incidents of our associations in the great wars; To inculcate a sense of individual obligation to the community, state and nation; To combat the autocracy of both the classes and the masses; To make right the master of might; To promote peace and good will on earth; To safeguard and transmit to posterity the principles of justice, freedom and democracy; To consecrate and sanctify our comradeship by our devotion to mutual helpfulness."

Now that we have reviewed what the mission is, we have to know how to carry it out. The American Legion does this through committees. A listing of committees, with a brief statement of purpose, which we have or would like to have as a Post are on a separate sheet in this newsletter. We would appreciate your keeping it as a reference while you determine how you may participate, or may already be participating, in the mission. For example, you may be helping with Bingo, driving for Silver Key, working with Scouts, contributing to the Christmas baskets, etc. All that we ask is that you keep me advised of what you do and how many hours you do it. This way we can make sure that this is included in our annual report and you can realize the satisfaction which comes as a result of your volunteer efforts. Please give this some thought because the few cannot do everything for the many, but many

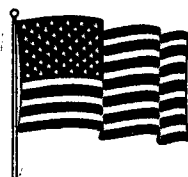
working together can do more than they might think possible! If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to call at 591-1952.

## AMERICAN LEGION COMMITTEES

### AMERICANISM

Purpose: To inspire patriotism and good citizenship through patriotic observances, patriotic and civic instruction in schools, Americanization of aliens, information on anti-American propoganda, youth activities such as Boy's State, Scouts, Oratorical Contest, School Award Medals, baseball, flag etiquette, and other similar community services, as well as provide a listing of available scholarships through the "Need A Lift?" booklet.

### CHILDREN AND YOUTH

Purpose: To insure that any child of a veteran in need of care and protection will receive that service and aid; to organize the Legion's strength in each community in the interest of children in general; to assist the community to reduce juvenile delinquency.

### VETERANS AFFAIRS AND REHABILITATION

Purpose: To assist veterans in obtaining needed hospitalization, in the prosecution of claims, and in obtaining other veteran's rights and benefits; to visit comrades who are sick or disabled; to visit and comfort members or their families when sick or bereaved.

### NATIONAL SECURITY

Purpose: To organize the post membership in support of national or civilian defense projects in the community; to organize the post and to assist in organizing the community for readiness to meet any emergency.

### MEMBERSHIP AND POST ACTIVITIES

Purpose: To obtain, retain and increase the membership of the post with specific responsibilities for renewals, enrollment of new members, transfers and reinstatements.

### PUBLIC RELATIONS

Purpose: To promote public support of the Legion's programs through publicity on post programs and activities in local newspapers or on radio, TV, etc.; by keeping the membership informed on American Legion programs in general through contact with The American Legion News Service and other news sources.

### LEGISLATIVE

Purpose: To promote public support of the Legion's programs through publicity objectives of The American Legion by a study of American Legion legislative proposals, information to the membership thereon, direct communication with members of the Congress or the state legislature as requested by the National Legislative Commission or proper department officials.

### FINANCE

Purpose: To supervise the receiving, disbursement and accounting of all post funds; to prepare annual budget recommendations for the post; to advise the post on all financial policies.

### ECONOMIC

Purpose: To serve and assist veterans in meeting and overcoming economic problems such as employment, veterans' preference, housing, civil service appeals, employment of handicapped and older workers.

### HOUSE

Purpose: To supervise the operation of physical facilities of a post such as a club room, American Legion center, meeting room, etc. Supervision includes administration, responsibility for equipment, hiring and direction of employees, as authorized by Post Executive Committee, and general rules applicable to the conduct of members while on the premises of the post.

## COMMITTEES CONTINUED

### GRAVES REGISTRATION AND MEMORIAL COMMITTEE

Purpose: To record, mark and decorate graves of deceased veterans; to render service and comfort to bereaved families; to provide American Legion funeral services when requested.

### SONS OF THE AMERICAN LEGION

Purpose: To act as a supervisory committee for the Sons of The American Legion Squadron in connection with its organization, activities, recreational and educational programs.

### UNIFORMED GROUPS

Purpose: To organize, train, promote and supervise a uniform group, such as drum and bugle corps, color guard, chorus, firing squad, etc.

### VISITING OR VAVS

The purpose of the visiting committee is to give comfort and assistance to members and their families when sick or bereaved, and to visit hospitalized veterans.
