From the Desk and Mind of the Commander Jay Bowen

When my boss learned that Woodland Park was under a mandatory evacuation, he sent a simple note to a buddy, "Tex, Keep the faith." The reply was just as simple and yet profound, "Bill, Faith is the only thing I have worth keeping!"

Like most of you, I watched the Waldo Canyon Fire wreak its havoc in horror and amazement. I saw a community come together as a family the likes of which I haven't seen since 9/11. There are no words to describe the acts of the brave men and women who risked their own lives to save the property and life of people they've never met and probably never will meet. They came from all across the Western states to help. Wow! What an effort. As I write this, we are at 98% contained. By the time you read it, we will be at 100% and this will be but a page in the history of Colorado, and merely a footnote in the history of our country. But to many of us, it will be one of those events we will remember for the rest of our lives. We were fortunate we only lost 346 homes and two lives. While I don't want to make light of those who are a part of the 346, the toll could have been much higher. Also, like many of you I had a multitude of family and friends call, text and send messages of hope and prayers for our safety. In particular, I had many friends post messages on my Facebook wall. You should know I don't do Facebook. If you were to visit my profile, you would laugh. It is pretty bare compared to many. After the fourth message asking for an update, I decided to brave the site and try to figure out how to reply. Apparently, all you have to do is post a message to your wall and all those with access will see it



What I found interesting was how many of my friends were writing about how devastated they would be if they were one of the 346 and lost all their memories.

While I cannot imagine how the 346 feel, like many of you I too have suffered losses. I would like to think I gained some very valuable perspective as a result. This really revisited me when Jackie and I prepared to leave for Grand Junction and I did a walk -through with a friend who planned to watch the house and help evacuate if necessary. As we evaluated the things I just HAD to have if we were told to leave, I set aside a 16 gauge shotgun (handed down from my grandfather), a small box of photos and my CPU (I also have a box with my Marriage License and Insurance Policies, which we took with us). But that was it. I realized the rest is just stuff! I was taking with me the one thing in my life I didn't want to lose; Jackie. Everything else could be replaced or not. Some people say their heirlooms remind them of loved ones. For me, there is nothing in my house that enhances the memories of those who have touched my life. I still remember my parents and in-laws so vividly that I don't need a photo to remind me who they were. Grandparents, friends who have moved or died still live in my mind as sharp as ever. I don't need a "Made in Mexico" knick-knack handed down or a faded photograph to remind me who they were. Don't get me wrong, I'm not a minimalist. I firmly believe he who has the most stuff when they die, WINS! But it is not so important that I'll forever feel a void if it is gone tomorrow. I had my irreplaceable jewel sitting next to me when I pulled out of the driveway. And with us both was our faith in God to see us through the fire. Everything else is just stuff.

For all of you affected by this fire and the fires in your life that will come, "Keep the Faith!"

Recently, I watched Anderson Cooper, on CNN, do an exposé on charities that collected millions of dollars for disabled Veterans yet none of the money got to Veterans. In fact, what this charity did donate to disabled Veterans organizations were M&Ms and chief's aprons (not any of the \$56 million that was collected).

The charities used a collection agency to solicit money through mailing lists of millions of names. The main focus of this exposé was a charity, Disabled Veterans National Foundation, a name and emblem that was so similar to the DAV that if you didn't look closely you would think it was the real thing. Let me warn you comrades, if you get solicitations from anyone stating that they are affiliated with a 501c Veterans organization, please check them out on the web, <u>www.CharityNavigator.org</u>, to confirm their legality.
