Due to security restrictions, Walter Reed cannot accept generic mail addressed to "A Recovering Soldier" or "Any Soldier." In past years, thousands of cards were returned to senders because of generic addresses, many sent in response to misleading e-mails.

HOWEVER, the Red Cross CAN accept, screen, and deliver holiday cards and letters sent to encourage our wounded heroes recovering at Walter Reed at the address shown above. Do NOT enclose gift cards or money.

Cards and letters should NOT be mailed before 4 November 2009, and postmarked NO later than December 7 to reach service members recovering at Walter Reed.

In summary, Thank all of you for caring and sharing your prayers with Jave and I; plus, let's see how many cards and letters we can send to our troops over the next two weeks!

Lastly, I just want to express my gratitude to all the Officers and Past Commanders who were able to pull off an outstanding Initiation Ceremony for the newly initiated members of Centennial Post 209. Thank you one and all, I am truly blessed to have you backing me up as Commander!

Easy Contact to US Congressman

Contact your U.S. Representative or Senator the easy way. Here's how. Each Representative and Senator has a web-page. Go to their web-page and click on the link for "contact" and then enter the personal information asked for, which is usually your name, address, phone number, and e-mail address. After that there is may be another dropdown box with various categories of topics, click on the topic that most closely fits your questions or comments and then go to the message box and type in your message, questions or comments. Then click on the send button. That is all there is to it. Easy! Then, within 12 to 24 hours a response is sent back from one of their staff members.

Example - to contact Representative Doug Lamborn of the 5th Congressional District, to get to his web-page, type: www.lamborn.house/gov and that will to his web-page. For Senator Bennet it would be www.bennet.senate/gov and that gets his web-page. A bit different for Senator Udall, there are two Senators Udall. Mark Udall from Colorado, and Tom Udall from New Mexico. In this case type in the senator's first name and last name. Example: Senator Mark Udall Colorado i t would from Now, go ahead www.markudall.senate.gov. and contact your representatives and senators. It is just (snap) that easy.
