She and her team will come to our Post and conduct these FREE training sessions.



It is open to anyone interested and capable to learn. It is not restricted to Legionnaires, Veterans, or adults. Patty told us the only requirement is you must be of age and mind to comprehend (that puts many of my Marine Corps buddies at risk). Sorry, I just couldn't resist that last part. Seriously, if you're willing to give up about 8 hours (we can do it in the evenings or weekends) to learn some great survival skills and how to be a first responder, let us know. I plan to try and set something up in March. I will need a headcount. We have to be able to tell Patty how many, and we need at least 10 people. I am confident we can get that number very easily.

Let's make March the month where we create a Post 209 CERT. And let's pray we never have to use the skills we learn.

Looking a little further down the road is the Blue and Gold Banquet. Anyone interested should attend the Post meeting in February as more information will be presented.



### STOP LOSS

Congress has extended the time frame in which a soldier that could be you or maybe you know of a soldier who was kept on active duty.

There are about 17,000 unpaid claims in the other services however, the Army has 58,000 expected claims to be paid and there is something like 35,000 not including the 28,000 claims that are pending

Because the Army cannot use the IRS and other government agencies to find the soldiers who need to file claims, it is up to organizations like the American Legion and Veterans like yourself to do the job.

I would like to ask you to take a moment and let everyone in your address book and ask those same to pass it on. It does take any money just the time to get the message out. If everyone did this, I am sure that within a week we could cover a huge numbers of veterans that have not filed claims.

VA Direct Deposit Update 01: The Department of the Treasury announced a new rule that will extend the safety and convenience of electronic payments to millions of Americans and phase out paper checks for federal benefits by 1 Mar 2013. Officials at the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) urge Veterans to sign up for electronic payment of their benefits. "Receiving VA benefits electronically will increase the security, convenience and reliability of these vital payments," said Secretary of Veterans Affairs Eric K. Shinseki. "VA encourages Veterans who are now receiving their benefits in paper checks to set up direct deposits before the deadline." On 1 Mar 2013, VA will stop issuing paper checks. People who do not have electronic payments for their federal benefits by that time will receive their funds via a pre-paid debit card. Called the Direct Express card, it is issued by Comerica Bank as the financial agent of the U.S. Treasury.

Another deadline affects people receiving VA's compensation or pensions for the first time after 1 May 2011. Those people will automatically receive the benefits electronically. Anyone already receiving federal benefit payments electronically will be unaffected by the changes. To learn more about the federal government's switch to direct deposit - or to change VA benefits to direct deposit -visit http://www.GoDirect.org. Information about the federal government's "Go Direct" campaign is also available at 800-333-1795. Along with payments for VA benefit, the change will also affect recipients of payments from Social Security, Supplemental Security Income, Railroad Retirement Board, or Office of Personnel Management. #### **VA Health Expansion**

VA Medical Benefits Update 02: In January 2008 Congress increased Combat Veterans benefits by extending the period of enhanced health care enrollment from 2 to 5 years post discharge for Veterans who served in the theater of operations during a period of war after the Persian Gulf War, or in combat against a hostile force during a period of hostilities after 11 Nov 98, In addition discharged from active duty before 28 Jan 03 who had not enrolled in VA's health care system were provided an enhanced enrollment window through 27 Jan 2011. This enhanced enrollment provides cost-free hospital care, medical services, and nursing home care for any illness determined to be possibly related to their combat service. Veterans whose enhanced enrollment eligibility is about to expire are encouraged to enroll by either for enrollment on-line applying at www.1010ez.med.va.gov/sec/vha/1010ez/, contacting VA at 877-222-8387, mailing an application to their local VA medical center or visiting the nearest VA health care facility to apply in person.
