From the Desk and Mind of the Commander

I'm convinced more and more that we are forgetting how to talk and write. We are replacing real words with acronyms in both speech and the written communication. The younger generation may think they invented the use of acronyms in communication, but for all of us that spent time serving our country in the US Military, we know better. Wow, what a learning process it was for me to try and understand 2, 3, and 4 letter abbreviations that replaced real words.

Having spent 20 years in Air Defense Artillery (or ADA), I am convinced we had more acronyms than actual words or phrases. I worked on a HIPIR (pronounced High Power) for almost three years before I discovered it was an acronym for High-Powered Illuminator Radar. And while I thought the HAWK missile was really cool, it was several years before I learned it too was an acronym for Homing All the Way Killer. We went TDY; we would PCS, DEROS or ETS. Every month we received our LES and checked to ensure our BAQ allowance was the correct amount. And if that wasn't bad enough, different branches of the Service used the same acronym that meant something totally different. I vividly remember on one occasion while stationed in Germany, I was preparing to DEROS and met with our local JAG. He asked if I wanted a PAR. Being in ADA, I immediately wondered how in the world could I ever ship a Pulse Acquisition Radar home in my HHGs. He saw the blank look and told me a PAR was a Power of Attorney Revocation. Oh, well that would be much easier to ship home than a radar with a 22' antenna span. Even in the same Service, we had problems communicating!



When I retired, I thought I had left that part of my world behind. Oh no! I worked for eight years in Telecommunications and they have at least as many acronyms used commonly to replace real words as we did in the Army. My favorite was the reference to the POTS line. This was a very commonly used term by telephone employees that indicated it was a telephone line to a residence. After about three months, I couldn't stand it any longer so I asked what the acronym stood for and was told with not even a smile on their face it was "Plain Old Telephone Service." Are you kidding me?

And now we are texting and Tweeting, and have lost all ability to write real words. We are OMG, and LOL, and if it's really funny, you'll more than likely see LMAO.

I've even seen this lack of effective communication on several resumes I've read lately. It's as if people are too lazy to spell. Don't misunderstand, I think acronyms definitely have a purpose and should be used in a resume, but not until they've been spelled out first. Otherwise, if I see MDA, I won't know if they are referring to the Missile Defense Agency, or the Maritime Domain Awareness, or one of other 120 common definitions.


225sf Portable Dance Floor - \$2500


