In regards to our membership, although we have reached goal we still have 290 members who have not renewed for the year 2010.

1 January 2010, National will mail out renewals notices to all who have not renewed by 1 November 2009. Please remember that it takes about two months from the time you send your membership renewal to the Post and it finally gets processed by National. If you should receive a renewal notice, please, check to see if you have your 2010 membership card and if you do, please through the renewal notice away, if you don't have your 2010 membership, will you take a moment and send your membership to The American Legion Post 209, P.O. box 25334, Colorado Spgs, Co 80936-5334. As a reminder our annual dues are \$ 35.00 a year.

We are currently at 427 Legionnaires for 2010 and our all time high was 525 Legionnaires back in 1990.

The Insurance company will send you information on other insurances that are available through the same Insurance company for you to review and/or request further information.
