




From the Membership Team

Lately, there have been a lot of questions in regards to the cost of a Paid Up For Life (PUFL) membership. Below is a table that shows what the end cost of a life membership would be.

If you are thinking about a PUFL membership you must have the current membership year paid, a readable copy of DD 214 must be included with the application.

If you would like, you can pay the full amount with a credit card or you can have monthly payments paid by your credit card for 36 months.

If you want more information you can call the Post at 719-599-8624 and leave a message or visit the Post at one of the functions and talk with me, or you can go to **www.legion.org** Once there, search for "Paid Up For Life" or "PUFL." It will take you to an information page that will give you more details.

Looking at these price may give some of you 2nd thoughts about going with a PUFL membership.

Before you throw everything out the window, I would like to provide you with some information on

a program being offered by the Department of Colorado.

Last year the Department instituted a program called "The Colorado Advanced Membership Payment Plan" (C.A.M.P.P).

This program allows you to pay for 3, 5, or 10 years of membership at \$35 per year (this is the Post's dues). For example, if you took 10 years times \$35 it would be \$350.00, paid up front.

I have to be honest, when the C.A.M.P.P program was announced I did not believe that there was any benefit to our members. But as I was going through and updating the membership cards and looking at the maturity of our members, I got to thinking about the benefits. When I am asked about the PUFL program and I provide the cost data, most people said it was too expensive, or I might not be alive in five years.

The C.A.M.P.P program has no differential in regards to age. You will receive your membership card each year in July and a letter indicating how many years you have left. If National, Department or the Post is forced to raise dues, you will not have to make up the difference until you renew again. You will not receive a dues renewal notice for the time that you are in in C.A.M.P.P. If you signed up for the free Life Insurance program, it will continue and you will not have to worry each year about where your coverage continues or not.

For those of you who are more mature (older), this could be a way of paying for say 10 years at \$350.00 versus \$839.16, \$740.16, \$644.04, \$550.08 etc. depending on your age when you consider a PUFL membership.
