


## Post 209 Honor Guard

Well here it is, we are in July and that starts the new membership year. You should be receiving your membership renewal cards for 2013. Please remember that if you transferred to the Post after 1 April, you will receive a renewal notice from your old Post. Please disregard that card and if you want to renew just prepare a check or money order for \$35.00 made to American Legion Post 209 and send it to American Legion Post, P.O. Box 25344, Colorado Springs, CO, 80936

The Department has a membership program called C.A.M.P.P. which may be of interest to many of you. Below is an excerpt from the Department describing the program.

**C.A.M.P.P.**

It is that time of our American Legion Year again – 1 July we will be asking everyone to renew and pay their 2013 dues. Let's all be Early Birds and pay our dues in July and August. To give everyone a choice, The American Legion State of Colorado are first again in the Nation to help our members.

1 July we introduce our new program; Department of COLORADO ADVANCED MEMBERSHIP PAYMENT PLAN (C.A.M.P.P.). The Program will be administrated through the Department. Lock-in your dues and eliminate annual dues notices. Just make one payment now and enjoy the convenience of not paying your dues each year. C.A.M.P.P. will process your dues each year and send you a new card. It is easy, just tell your Post you want to sign up under C.A.M.P.P. or just call the Department and tell them you want to be a member of C.A.M.P.P. You can pay by check or use your credit card.

C.A.M.P.P. is a simple and convenient method of paying your dues in advance to lock-in your current dues rate and avoid receiving those annoying annual dues notices in the mail. To join C.A.M.P.P all you need to do is pay your annual dues in advance for 3, 5 or 10 years. It's that simple. When you join C.A.M.P.P. the cost of your dues is guaranteed for the term you choose. You don't have to worry about your Post dues increasing while you are with C.A.M.P.P.

Each year in July C.A.M.P.P. will automatically pay your dues for the following year to National, Department and your Post and send you a current Membership card. You will never be delinquent and even better you will not receive dues notices in the mail.

Current Legion members can join C.A.M.P.P. by paying dues for 3, 5 or 10 years in advance along with a small 10% administrative fee.

For example, if your Post dues are \$35 and you want to join C.A.M.P.P. for 10 years, your cost is \$35 times 10. So for only \$350.00 your dues are paid up and you are protected from any dues increase for 10 years.

Wheelchairs for Disabled Veterans is a program started by Jack Levinson of VFW Post 9741 out of Firestone, CO.

The program is an ongoing drive to collect donated scooters and electric wheelchairs and get them to Veterans who need them. It doesn't matter if your disability is war-related. It just matters that you served and you need help now. There is no cost to take part Jack said, and only one requirement. When the chair's no longer needed, let him know so it can be made ready for the next Veteran.
