There will be no COLA increase this year, first time in 35 years.

Last year we received a rather large 5.8% COLA raise (the highest since 1983) but this year we will get nothing. Luckily the "Hold Harmless" law prohibits Medicare premiums for Par B from rising in any year there is no Social Security COLA, therefore the vast majority of seniors will be exempt from higher Part B premiums next year.

The Government CBO is now projecting that there may be no COLAs for the next year or two.

First, on the news 3 Oct we heard about the Battle for Camp Keating, Afghanistan in which 8 soldiers from 3/61<sup>st</sup> Cav from Fort Carson were killed and the rest of the personnel lost all of their belongings.

If you go to <u>http://burnpit.legion.org</u> you can read about what happened. However, the exciting news is that The American Legion has raised more than \$30,000.00 and that Target is going to provide matching funds to purchase things that are needed.

National has picked Post 209 to be the primary drive in purchasing the required items and package them for shipment to Virginia where they will be transshipped to Afghanistan.

On Saturday, 24 October, members of the American Legion Riders and VFW Riders will be gathering at the Post to depart to local Target stores to purchase the pre-selected items. Members of the Post, Auxiliary and families of the soldiers from the 3/61<sup>st</sup> at Fort Carson will be assembling at Post 209 at 11:00 AM to prepare food for all the volunteers and help to package the items and load them onto vehicles for shipment.
