This is not an opinion, nor is it something that would just be in bad taste (which it would be). It is ILLEGAL! Our National charter restricts our organization from being aligned with any political party. If it is perceived we are doing that, we can lose our charter, which means we lose our ability to present ourselves as a nonprofit. That means we lose our ability to continue helping Veterans. You're probably thinking, "Hey wait a minute. I've seen political figures at Legion

In March 2010, VA announced a new initiative to "fast track" the claims process for presumptive service-connected illnesses due to Agent Orange Exposure during the Vietnam War.

With this new approach, VA expects to shorten the time it takes to gather evidence, which now takes on average over 90 days. Once the claim is fully developed and all pertinent information is gathered, VA will be able to more quickly decide the claim and process the award, if granted.

The following is proposed changes to Centennial Post 209's Constitution and By-Laws. There are other, mostly grammatical changes but those listed below are the only changes of existing rules to both documents. There are complete copies of both documents available for your review at the Post, as well on our web site in the "Local News" section. We will vote to accept/reject these proposed changes at our monthly membership meeting on 13 November. In accordance with Article IX, Section 2 of our Post Constitution, a 2/3rd majority vote is needed to approve these revisions. I will read all recommended changes to the Constitution and By-Laws during the October membership meeting on 9 October.

CONSTITUTION ARTICLE IV Government

<u>Section 1</u> - The officers of this Post shall be a commander, a senior vice-commander, a junior vice-commander, an adjutant, a finance officer, a chaplain, an historian, a service officer, a sergeant-at-arms, a judge advocate, the immediate past Post commander, and a Post Executive Committeeman.

BY-LAWS ARTICLE II The Executive Committee

<u>Section 6</u> - Seven members of the Executive Committee shall constitute a quorum for the conduct of business.

ARTICLE IV Duties of Officers

<u>Section 4</u> - ... Any disbursement in excess of \$500 shall be approved by signature of the Post Commander or other member of the Executive Committee. ...

ARTICLE V The Board of Trustees

<u>Section 7</u> - ... The Board will meet at a frequency determined necessary by the President, to consider such business as may come before it. ...

ARTICLE VI Appointments

<u>Section 1</u> - The Post Commander, immediately upon taking office each year, shall appoint the following standing

committees and shall designate a chairman for each committee: Program Planning and Social Committee, and Welcoming Committee

ARTICLE VII Duties of Standing Committees

Section 1 - The Program and Planning Committee shall be responsible for planning programs for the Legion year, preparing and submitting to the Executive Committee both short and long range plans for the conduct of post activities. This includes, but is not limited to, financial planning and fund raising, securing speakers for post meetings, and for planning post observances of national holidays and other significant community events.

<u>Section 2</u> - The Welcoming Committee consists of two or three members who are asked to take on the job of welcoming new members, guests, or even older members who are not well acquainted, making them feel at home, and introducing them.

Section 8 - The Club Committee will assist the Club Manager on organizing events at the Post home and ensuring schedules are posted for all events supported by the Post. They will assist create and maintain the Post Home Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) and ensure the SOP is followed by all Post members.

ARTICLE XI Rules of Order

All proceedings of this Post shall be conducted under and pursuant to Roberts' Rules of Order, except as may be provided by action of the Post Commander. THE AMERICAN LEGION CENTENNIAL POST 209 P.O. BOX 25334 COLORADO SPRINGS, CO 80936-5334
