But you didn't and now you're thinking either he is a real dirt-bag or he's someone you would like to party with in the near future.

We have gotten it resolved and our PO Box 25334, Colorado Spgs, Co 80936 remains the same. If this has caused you a hardship, we apologize.




From Senior Vice Commander Mark Krzeczowski Larry Johnson

"Since my last email regarding the signing by President Obama of the legislation on Camp LeJeune and the Department of Veterans Affairs, I contacted the VA regarding the list of illnesses and the application to family members and here is the response:

'Just to be clear, Veterans should have no problem getting established in the system (see below). It is family members who we can't take now because of the law regarding approps and the need for us to publish regs. My colleagues will check with VHA to see if there is any guidance regarding anything for family members to do at the moment.' The list of conditions is as follows:

(i) Esophageal cancer.
(ii) Lung cancer.
(iii) Breast cancer.
(iv) Bladder cancer.
(v) Kidney cancer.
(vi) Leukemia.
(vii) Multiple myeloma.
(viii) Myleodysplasic syndromes.
(ix) Renal toxicity.
(x) Hepatic steatosis.
(xi) Female infertility.
(xii) Miscarriage.
(xiii) Scleroderma.
(xiv) Neurobehavioral effects.
(xv) Non-Hodgkin's lymphoma.

As we receive information, we will be glad to forward to you. I realize that not all of our Veterans were at Camp LeJeune but you may have friends or family members who served during the timeframe and are not aware of the issue. Please feel free to pass along the information."
