HAPPY HANUKKAH

Hanukkah, or Festival of Lights, is a Jewish Holiday. It means “dedication” and starts this year on December 7. It is a time for family and friends to gather around the table to commemorate the rededication of God’s Temple in Jerusalem, which was desecrated by Syrian armies around 260 B.C. The ceremony is done by lighting one of the eight candles of the Menorah or candelabra. Then, one more is lit each night where a blessing is given. The feasting begins with music and foods such as Potato Latke, gingerbread, cakes, cheese and tangerines. Children receive gifts and play games. According to tradition Judah and his followers, the Macabees, went into battle and reclaimed the Temple from the Syrian king. After the Temple was repaired and cleansed, it was rededicated. When the Menorah’s wick was lit there was barely enough sacred oil to last for one day. Yet, miraculously, the oil stayed burning for eight days. This celebration signifies the challenge to live God’s commandments.
