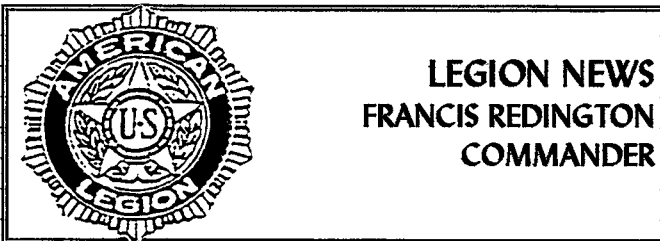

The cars were weighed and measured in pre-qualification. Cars are judged in three categories, "Most Colorful," "Most Original." All winners of design and racing were awarded trophies. There was good attendance by families and we all had a lot of fun. This Cub Scout Pack has a great group of boys and I am glad our Post supports this worthwhile group.

Thanks to all who helped make that possible as this has really been a team effort. However, that doesn't mean we can rest on our laurels. We always have people moving or to Post Everlasting so we need to continue increasing the rolls for those who must leave.

Keep our oratorical contestant, Mark Ehlers, in your thoughts. We think he has an excellent chance to do very well, but he needs our support in all ways.

As we get close to nominating and electing officers for the coming year, I think it will be good to go over some of the positions and committees that your Post strives to fill to accomplish it's mission of veterans helping veterans and their families.

The Past Commanders are important to a Commander as they represent continuity and history. The Commander is the one charged with the responsibility of ensuring the wishes of the membership are received and acted upon. The Commander has overall responsibility for the programs the Post chooses to participate in. The Commander is arbitrator, peacemaker, tactician, and overseer as needed. The Commander must be knowledgeable for the members and the public as needed.

The Senior Vice Commander assists the Commander and usually is planning to become the next Commander. Thus, this person is in training while looking at possibilities for the coming year. The Senior Vice Commander's primary concern is membership. This person also fills in for the Commander when necessary.

One of our programs is The American Legion Oratorical contest. The chair of this committee visits high schools talking with teachers and principals about the contest and the benefits derived from participation. This position has training required to insure uniformity and fairness for the contest.

The Boys State program is another favorite. The chair of this committee insures that the schools and eligible boys have all the materials needed for those interested in learning how our government works. The Post makes the selection of applicants, and they attend the University of Southern Colorado, Sunday through Thursday in June. They are usually quite surprised at all they accomplish and learn.

The Post supports a Cub Pack. The chair of this committee meets with the Pack for liaison of activities. We sponsor the pack and maintain a scholarship fund for those boys unable to pay to belong.

We also sponsor an American Legion baseball team each year made up of boys from Mitchell High School. The liaison from the Post maintains communication with the

coach for the purposes of our sponsorship and other needs.

Our fundraising has been bingo and as you know we may be able to return to that, if we have your support.

The Junior Vice Commander is the one who plans our social events based on input from the membership and such traditional events as the Early Bird dinner, Christmas party, The American Legion birthday dinner and the Installation banquet, etc.

The Adjutant would be the secretary in other organizations. Duties are administrative and include keeping membership records, minutes of meetings, post records filed and assisting elsewhere as needed. At this time the Adjutant also does the bulk mailing of the newsletter.

The Finance Officer pays bills and sends membership fees to Department. This person insures the deposit of all monies and prepares a financial report for the general membership meetings.

The Historian has the responsibility of recording our past events in pictures and written records. We are blessed to have a videographer in our midst as well as taking pictures with a regular camera.

The Sergeant-at-Arms assists at all meetings in the arrangement of the hall, passing out minutes and the preamble, preserving order, and otherwise helping other officers as needed. This person also insures the colors of the Puuuuuuost are present at local ceremonial events.

The Chaplain opens and closes our meetings with prayer. The Chaplain visits members who are ill and attends services, where possible, of those members who have gone to the Post Everlasting. A sympathy card is sent to the family. A short memorial service is held.

The Service Officer has the job of helping veterans who may have need of aid in some way. This person and the Post maintain contact with both the local and department level of organizations and individuals that can assist, depending upon the nature of the problem.

There you have it. Look these over to see if you might come forward to help. This is your Post and can only be as good as you help to make it that way!
