The Sergeant-at-Arms assists at all meetings in the arrangement of the hall, passing out minutes and the preamble, preserving order, and otherwise helping other officers as needed. This person also insures the colors of the Puuuuuuuost are present at local ceremonial events.

The Chaplain opens and closes our meetings with prayer. Chaplain visits members who are and attends services, where those members possible, of have gone to the Post Everlasting. A sympathy card is sent to the family. A short memorial service is held.

The Service Officer has the job of helping veterans who may have need of aid in some way. This person and the Post maintain contact with local and department both the level of organizations and that individuals assist. can depending upon the nature of the problem.
