##### PROPOSED LAW TO SCUTTLE VETERANS JOB ASSISTANCE

WASHINGTON (ALNS) - The American Legion is mustering legislative forces to counterattack legislative proposal which would end job assistance and training for veterans.

The Reagan administration has submitted legislative proposal to Congress to eliminate the federal requirement for a state Employment Service system, and would abolish the United States Employment Service at the national level.

The American Legion has been aware of such a proposal, even though the Department of labor denies such action. Last October, the Legion participated in a series of Labor Department hearing on the future of the ES, the results to be published in the Federal Register. Despite the Labor Department representation to the contrary, the report of the independent contractor hired to formulate the results of those hearings states clearly that "most respondents felt that the current ES system need finetuning, rather than an complete overhaul.

The administration proposal is part of the Trade, Employment, and Productivity Act of 1987. Under one section of this legislation-- the Employment Services act of 1987 - states would no longer be required to operate an ES, but merely to provide public employment services through whatever mechanism the governor designates. Moreover, Private industry Councils, which now oversee the Job Training Partnership Act(JTPA) program, would be granted monitoring and evaluating powers over such a program.

Federal financing would cease as of July 1, 1990.

## HOUSE PANEL PROPOSES MORE VA FUNDS IN '88

WASHINGTON (ALNS) - The American Legion has praised action by the House Committee on Veterans Affairs to correct several inadequacies in the proposed Veterans Administration budget for Fiscal Year 1988.

In February the Congressional Committee recommended a budget with a \$716 million increase over that proposed by Office of Management and Budget. This increase includes \$246 million for VA health care, and a rejection of the increase for VA home loan users fee.

The Proposal also asked for \$50 million to continue the Veterans Job Training Act. Also within the plan is an increase to the State Veterans home per diem rates paid by VA to reimburse State Nursing Home Care.

Education secretary outlines two challenges facing nation

Washington (ALNS) - Secretary of Education, William J. Bennett said that there were two major challenges facing this nation. Number one is the Defense of Western Civilization and the second was to "Nurture and Protection of our children, and all else is small compared to those two". Mr Bennett said " I know of no other organization in this country whose aims are clearer, more significant, more important and with which I identify more".

"I am confident if we teach history to our students, they will come to the same conclusion that I know members of The American Legion have come to: that we are the last best hope on earth." he concluded.
