

This "backdoor" action would eliminate the current fair treatment of all groups. This action by the administration is a serious breach of faith and sends the wrong message to those who so magnificently served to protect our freedoms, most 0 recently in Desert Shield and Desert Storm. I respectfully request that you strongly oppose any effort by the administration to remove military and federal civilian COLAs from the statutory protection against sequestration that now

The President's FY93 Budget proposes to subject military and federal civilian COLAs to automatic cuts whenever government spending exceeds the deficit reduction target. It was this same procedure that resulted in our loss of a 3.1 percent COLA in 1985. To help us counter this threat, send The Military Coalition's COLA Equity Message to both your senators and your representative today! To send The Military Coalition Message:

- Dial Western Union's toll-free hotline number 1-800-392-5700. This service is available seven days a week, 24 hours a day.
- Give the operator your full name, address, zip code and telephone number. Ask the operator to send our prestored messages to your two Sena-

tors and Representative. It is not necessary to know their names or addresses to send the messages. The operator has this information.

- The total cost of your three messages is \$7.00. A confirmation copy will cost an additional \$1.00. This can be charged to your phone bill or a VISA or MASTERCARD credit card. In Alaska and Hawaii, it must be charged to a VISA or MASTERCARD.
- Those callers whose phone service is provided by US WEST will receive an invoice directly from Western Union instead of charges on their phone bill.
