This is an important meeting for the future of Post 209 Auxiliary. We will be meeting April 17 at 7:00 P.M. at the DAV. Please come.



CHANGE TO THE CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

Article V Section 5 currently reads:

Vacancies on the Board of Trustees as a result of resignation, death, incapacity or removal for cause or other circumstances shall be appointed by the Comamnder and approved by the Executive Committee.

Add:

Any member of the Board who has missed three (3) consecutive meetings of the Board, without being excused, will be removed from the Board and the vacancy filled by appointment by the Commander and approved by the Executive Committee.

AGT NOW TO END HEALTH GARE DISGRIMINATION!

Tell Congress to Keep Health Care Promises Call 1-800-392-5700

Last year, Congress "blinked" at the last minute and failed to enact a test program of Medicare subvention, the first step toward restoring health care equity to Medicare-eligible retirees of the uniformed services.

The 24 military and veterans' associations of The Military Coalition (TMC) are committed to winning legislation in 1997 that will move us toward that goal on two fronts. Medicare subvention would help end the current "lockout" from military hospitals and clinics by authorizing Medicare to partially reimburse the Department of Defense for seeing additional Medicare-eligibles in those facilities. FEHBP-65 would authorize Medicare-eligible uniformed services beneficiaries to enroll in the same Federal Employees Health Benefits Program the government already offers every other federal retiree.

Congress is waking up to the magnitude of the problem, but there are lots of other issues on the congressional agenda, and "the squeaky wheel gets the grease." You can help ensure the government keeps its promises to uniformed services retirees by using the Health Care Equity Hotline to send Mailgrams urging your two U.S. senators and your U.S. representative to sign on as cosponsors for subvention and FEHBP-65 legislation. Here's how:

- Dial Western Union's toll-free Health Care Equity Hotline number, 1-800-392-5700. The hotline is open seven days a week, 24 hours a day. If you have Internet access, you can send the same Mailgrams via TROA's Web site (http://www.troa.org/legis/mailgram.html).
- Give the operator your full name, address, ZIP code, and telephone number. Ask the operator to send our prestored health care equity Mailgrams to your elected officials. You don't need to know their names or addresses; Western Union will automatically send your messages to the right legislators.
- Three Western Union messages will be hand delivered the following day to your two U.S. senators and your U.S. representative.
- You will be billed \$6.75 directly on your phone bill. In areas where telephone billing is not possible, the operator will give you the option of receiving an invoice directly from Western Union or placing the charge on a VISA or MasterCard.

- Uniformed services retirees deserve no less.
- Please help champion the cause of health care equity for uniformed services retirees by cosponsoring the following bills: H.R. 76
- (FEHBP-65) would let Medicare-eligible retirees sign up for the same
- Federal Employees Health Benefits Program (FEHBP) already afford-
- ed all other federal retirees; H.R. 414 (Medicare subvention) would
- authorize Medicare to partially reimburse the Department of Defense
- for treating additional Medicare-eligibles in military treatment facilities; H.R. 192 would authorize the same subvention concept as H.R.
- 414, but as a demonstration test.
