
FLECTION OF POST OFFICERS

As The American Legion Deputy to Satellite Clinic, VA attended а special meeting February 26 which brought everyone to date on the Southern Colorado Healthcare System which includes the Satellite Clinic. also heard from the Vet Center I want to share some downtown. insight from that meeting which I think you may find interesting.

At the Fort Lyon facility, 50% veterans with or higher service-connected disability rating may now receive nursing indefinite home care as an Those with a 0 - 40%contract. rating may get a six month contract and after that may be able to continue with Medicaid and/or other types of funding for the same care.

Substance abuse is not an outpatient treatment program. There is a Task Force working on this issue for our community and they would welcome help.

Tom Clifford is the Coordinator for Homeless Veterans for the Southern Colorado Healthcare System. His office is at the Clinic. He is assisted by Philip von Steinmann. Dr Jeff Harizon of the Clinic staff is the Clinic Paso representative to the El County Homeless Coalition.
