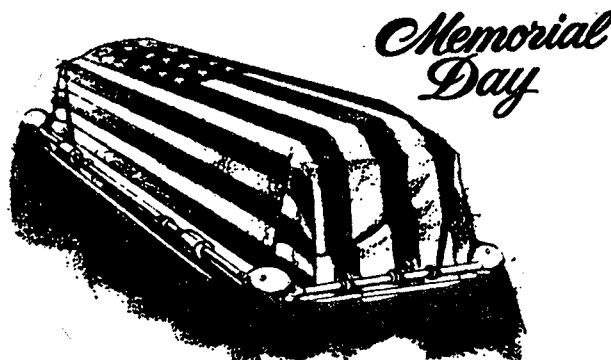

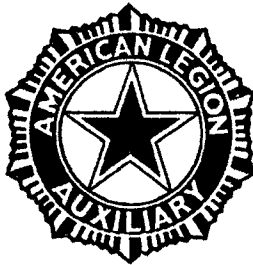
# INSTALLATION OF OFFICERS 2001


# In Their Honor Fly-in
