We look forward to meeting or seeing you at our next meeting.



## From the Adjutant Larry Johnson

I know some of you get upset once, maybe twice a year regarding membership because you mail in your renewal dues on time after the first notice, and then find yet another renewal notice in your mailbox. I know this because I get your letter with a copy of the check or check number and the date it was cashed.

Let me try and share with you how the National Organization works in regards to membership.

**Right now,** National is in the process of pulling all of the information about membership and they are in the process of printing the renewal cards for 2013.

Members typically get five (5) renewal notices a year. The 1st renewal notice comes out the 1st of July. This is the official start of our membership drive for the new year. The 2nd renewal notice is in October. The 3rd renewal notice is in January, and the 4th notice is in March. The 5th and final renewal notice is in May.

Please consider this; you send your renewal by mail to the Post. I receive it, process the renewal and mail it to Department (State HQ). Department will process your renewal and then mail it to National. With almost 3 million members, it could take National up to a week to get your information processed, even in this automated age.

National pulls renewal notices about 45 days from the scheduled mailings. So the 2nd renewal notices will be pulled sometime in August for printing. If you send me your renewal and I process it on the 13th of August, by the time it gets to National and is posted, it is normally after the date that the next renewal list is pulled for printing, therefore you will get another renewal notice.

If you don't want to receive numerous renewal notices, there are options available to you.

In order to do that, you must first change the mindset that you can only renew on the day that you joined each year. Membership runs from 1 January to 31 December for everyone. So renewing in July won't change your membership date.

Renewing in July for 2013 still means your membership is good from January to December for that year. But it will prevent multiple renewal notices.

One option other than the traditional method of sending us a check, is to renew your membership through our web site using PayPal. This convenience is for our members and won't cost you any more than if you send us a check or money order. And you don't have to be a member of PayPal to renew.

You can also consider two other options. One of those is a program the Department of Colorado began last year (called CAMPP). Under this program you can basically renew your membership for 3, 5, 7 or 10 years. The way it works is that you pay \$35.00 (which is our yearly dues) per year in advance so if you wanted to do 10 years the cost would be \$ 35.00 times 10 or \$350.00. All dues noticed would stop, and every year Department would send you a membership for the current year and provide a note showing how many years you have left in the program. The nice thing about this is if the Post had to raise the dues per year you would not have to pay the difference until your CAMPP membership expires. When you reach the end of the program, you can sign up for another round at the current Post dues rate, if Department still offers the program.

The 2nd option is to look into the Paid-Up-For-Life (PUFL). This is a program just like it says. You are a member who paid-up-for-life. The cost depends on your age and our dues at the time you sign up.

You can go [www.legion.org](http://www.legion.org) and put in Paid-Up-For-Life to get more information or you can contact us. We can work up the cost and offer recommendations to help you decide which is the best option. One of the nice things about PUFL is you will never receive another renewal notice and if the annual dues are raised by National, Department or the Post, you do not have to pay the increase. The only requirement is that you must be a member in good standing, meaning you need to have the current year dues paid.
