POLICY ON LIBYA SET AT 1983 CONVENTION

Indianapolis (ALNS) - As early as 1983, the American Legion was sounding ghe alarm over the threat of the Regime of Moammar Khadafy in Libya to peace and harmony in the world. In the tradition of the Nation's largest veterans organization - The first to label Adolph Hitler the enemy of peace, the first to denounce Joseph Stalin as the foe of freedom - delegates to the 65th (1983) National Convention, Seattle, Wash., referred to Khadafy as "this strident, megalomaniacal little man" who "poses a real threat to the peace and tranquility of North Africa and the middle east and indirectly to the free world.' In adopting Resolution No. 425, a general policy statement on Libya for the American Legion. The convention delegates called for continued U.S. vigilance toward Libya and for the nation to be prepared "to resist promptly and effectively any evert actions or outright attacks against the United States or its allies on the part of Libya."

AIR STRIKE OF LIBYA DRAWS LEGION SUPPORT

washington (ALNS) - The American Legion responded swiftly and unequivocally to support President Reagan's order for an air strike against Libya military targets in retaliation for terrorist activity which resulted in the death of an American serviceman and the injury of many civilians in a Weat Berlin night club. In a Telegram April 15 to the President, National Commander Dale L. Renaud said "the American Legion strongly supports your forthright action to counter terrirism and retaliate swiftly and decisively against perpetrators of Terrorist acts. The American Legion pledges its support to any action you deem necessary to try to solve this deliberate, unfortunate, and unexcusable terrorist situation.

"We sincerely hope that actions taken yesterday by the Armed Forces of the United States will convince those who attack innocent civilians of the swift, sure, and just response they will suffer. "We urge the U.S. Government to continue its vigilance to resist promptly and effectively any terrorist attacks against the United States or our allies."

Renaud's message of support was in conformance with American Legion position established through National Convention action. Delegates to the 67th (1985) National Convention in New Orleans adopted Resolution No. 178 - "Terrorism" - which gives Legion support to "initiatives taken by the President and urges the U.S. government carry through by assigning the highest priority to combatting terrorism and to retaliate swiftly and decisively against perpetrators of terrorist acts." The resolution also expressed the legions support for any action of the President which "he may deem necessary" to resolve the terrorist situation.

VA SMALL BUSINESS LOANS

The Small Business Administration says one of its most misunderstood programs is the direct loan for Vietnam era and disabled veterans. The loan progam is a pool of money set aside to insure that there will be money to lend veterans even after other SBA funds are exhausted or the bands won't make money available to qualified loan applicants for reasons like overdue payback (the average SBA loan is nine years), or too little money for the length of the loan.

A veteran wishing to apply for an SBA loan should have a good business plan and show that the loan will be as secure as reasonable to assure repayment. Available collateral and other guarantees will be required. Veterans loans must meet the same criteria as regular business loans and can only be made if a guaranteed loan or other credit is not available.

VA OFFICIAL DEBUNKS DISMANTLEMENT FEAR

Indianapolis (ALNS) - The cries about "threats of dismantling the VA" just "don't make any sense," Deputy VA administrator Everett Alvarez, Jr has told the National Executive Committee of the American Legion. In a speech to the NEC just before his May 10 resignation, Alvarez debunked the warnings of impending doom of the VA pointing to the services and care provided by the veterans administration. He encouraged the Legionleaders to "look at things in reality" and to continue to "provide guidance to the Veterans Administration and to Administration." Alvares declared that the concept of a veterans administration system "has the support of the President, the congress, and the people." At the time, he said that the VA has been far too slow to adopt efficiencies as has the private sector and that the VA "has to do a better job of managing changes. "Gramm-Rudman (balanced budget legislation) can be a convenient excuse for inaction." Alvarex said, and that in such an environment, budgets must be justified much more than in the past. "This is a time for innovation," he stated, "especially in Legion programs. The American Legion's traditional role will be more crucial, such as in its efforts to put pressure on the Administration." Alvarez said, Wwe all mut go forward and face the challenges which may affect veterans' rights and benefits. But since when are Americans veterans not up to a challenge?" Describing the Legion as "a worthy adversary," Alvarex said "We may have differed about how things hould be done. But we have never disagreed on the ends." He said that he has been "Truly fortunate to have been able to have served in such a enviable position and the satisfaction I have is immeasurable."
