As the Legion year (7/1/91 - 6/30/92) draws to a close, I look back in retrospect and thank each one who has made this year successful.

We began by acquiring 7.4 acres of land in a prime location of this city for our future Post Home. We formed committees and chairpersons to carry out The American Legion programs. We participated in the Oratorical Contest, American Legion Baseball Program at Mitchell High School, Boy Scouts, Cub Pack 240 and sent nine high school boys to American Legion Boys State. We sponsored "A Tribute to Veterans" (Temporary Financial Assistance Program). This program, held in Acacia Park, was put on by two post/unit members, Bessie Frank and Al Lender. During the year, two initiation ceremonies were conducted and 34 Legionnaires were formally initiated.

We took two tons of clothing to HOMELAKE NURSING HOME in Monte Vista. Christmas donations went to the veterans at COLORADO STATE HOSPITAL in Pueblo. Birthday cakes, donuts and stuffed animals cheered up several patient vets at FLORENCE NURSING HOME in Florence; one of them being our own lifetime member of this Post, John Greco, who became 98 years old on May 21st. He was in great spirits and continually sang in French! Our annual trip to FT LYON VETERANS HOSPITAL in Las Animas was very rewarding. Each year, we take as many people as will go, donate clothing, books, etc., and always present a cash donation of \$500 in honor of our deceased Past Commander, John Gaillard.

We had our annual picnic and Christmas party which was enjoyed by both adults and children. We gave 16 Christmas baskets to needy families and helped many stranded veterans on their way. We marched in the July 4th and Veterans Day parades.

Thanks to the "moneymakers" of the Post, the Bingo workers, Club Manager, Nedra and Connie (volunteers for "Stud tickets"), Dave Thomas of the Ways & Means for the rummage sale and most of all, my husband, Neal Thomas, who did ALL of the above!

I was asked how I was able to carry out so many functions this year, that of 100% Post Commander, 100% District 7 Commander, Department Junior Vice Commander over Districts 7 and 8 which were both 100% Membership Districts and work a fulltime job at the Regional Building Department. First of all, let me give God the glory, without Him, I could do nothing. Secondly, it took the support of each of you and your efforts. But, it would have been impossible without the help and support of my husband, Neal, without the love and realizing the needs of the veterans, without the love of The American Legion and without the love I have for America.

Remember, there is Strength in Unity...and together, we are winners!
