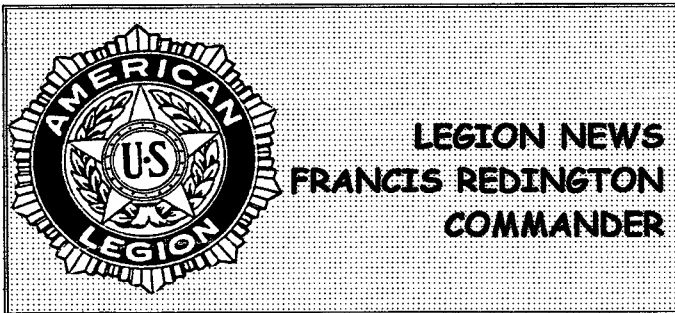


# CENTENNIAL POST 209

Many veterans gathered in Memorial park in support and remembrance of fellow veterans who paid the ultimate price or who are still POW/MIAs.



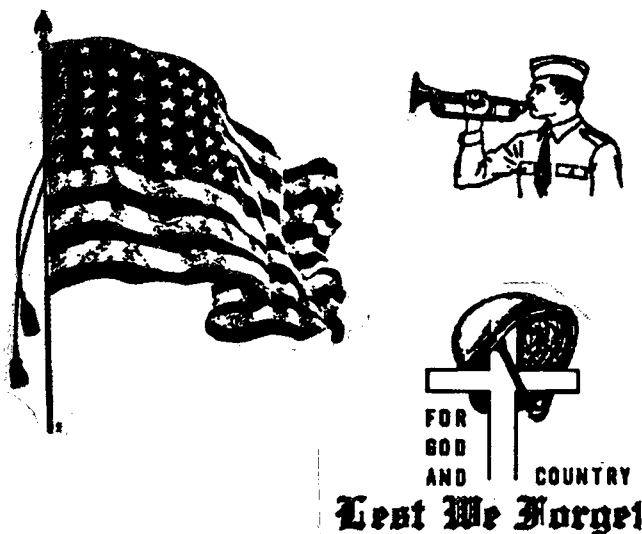
June 14<sup>th</sup> is Flag Day, followed by the July 4<sup>th</sup> celebration of our country's birthday.

**ADJUTANT'S ANNOTATIONS  
ANN FOSTER**

I attended the Department Leadership Training along with our Commander Francis Redington, Historian Norm Moyer, Judge Advocate Neal Thomas, Service Officer Tom Morant and member John Davies. I think we had the largest group of Legionnaires from any Post. No matter how many times I go to this event I always learn something. This time I appreciated adding to my knowledge of parliamentary procedures and membership recruiting.

There was a break out session for adjutants which was both a review of past procedures and a briefing on new changes. One thing we were advised on was the amount of processing time by Department and National. This is a six week process for the most part. If you delay paying dues after receiving your renewal notice, there is a good chance you will get a second notice before your payment been recorded. National processes membership for close to 3 million members so this is not something done overnight. Check your card and your check register if you are in doubt.

This year all permanent member cards will be mailed directly to the member from department. This program will be closed to new members and the National Paid Up For Life (PUFL) will start in July as the replacement. The bad news is PUFL costs a bit more than our program. The good news is that you may pay for this membership in one of three ways: 1) check for the whole amount; 2) 10% down payment and continued monthly payments until paid off; and 3) use your plastic money card. If you think you might be interested in this program which would mean not having to pay dues on a yearly basis, please leave us a message. Your age and our current dues are the necessary ingredients. We will be happy to consult the chart and advise you.
