MEANS TEST ADMIN PROCEDURES EYED, VETERANS' MEDICAL CARE TOP PRIORITY

Washington (ALNS) -- As new administrative procedures concerning VA medical care take effect July 1, The American Legion has vowed to monitor their implementation to protect the best interest of veterans.

On July 1, those veterans seeking VA medical care for non-service connected disabilities will be subjected to a "means test" which will try to establish the resources they have at their disposal to help pay for such care. In addition, the VA will attempt to recover from veterans' insurance policies some of the cost of the care effective Oct 1.

As the only veterans organization to oppose the mean test, The American Legion has vowed to monitor the progress of its implementation, and try to ensure that veterans deserving medical treatment are not denied it because of bureaucratic paper shuffling.

In a letter to VA Administrator Thomas K. Turnage, the Legion's director of Veterans Affairs and Rehabilitation outlined the concerns of the nations largest veterans organization with the proposed regulations for implementing the means test.

"We accept the fact that (the means test) is now law, and feel that it is a responsibility of this organization to express our concerns," wrote Robert E. Lyngh.

Amongh the main concerns with the new law is Congressional language which, in the Legion's opinion, would provide an entitlement for health care from the VA to eligible veterans. The law says that hospital care "SHALL (emphasis added) be provided," changing from the language used heretofore, "may be provided." This subtle change could have far-reaching implications for VA provided health care.

"There is a vast difference of opinion regarding the legal interpretation of the term 'shall,'" Lyngh said. He pointed out that the leadership of the House Veterans Affairs Committee trumpeted this change as its attempt to guarantee care for deserving veterans. However, the VA's general counsel said that the change has no effect whatever, since there are no funds provided for paying for the change. Lyngh urged the VA chief to resolve the issue.

The law also requires non-service-connected veterans in VA facilities, if their incomes are over a certain level, to pay the equivalent of the Medicare deductible (currently \$492) to the VA to defray the cost of their care. No provision is made for veterans who transfer from a non-VA hospital, where the deductible may already have been paid for Medicare coverage. As it stands now, the veterans would have to pay the amount twice.

"This would be unfair to the veteran," Lyngh wrote to Turnage, "and the regulations should be amended so the inequity would not be allowed to happen."

In addition, there is no provision to reimburse a veteran for a deductible paid for treatment of a condition later determined to be service-connected. The Legion urges that this section be clarified.

VA guidelines for implementing the changes include procedures to charge veterans for simply showing up at a VA facility and filing out eligibility forms for later admission.

"A veteran should not be charged for medical care that is not given," Lyngh said. He likened the procedure to a private doctor's charging for a patient to call and make an appointment.

The agency plans to establish priorities for admission to the hospitals despite the fact that neither the House nor the Senate intended for priorities to be set. The Legion questions the VA's plans to implement the law calling for a means test. Under federal administrative procedures, changes in federal regulations have to be published in the Federal Register and interested parties have 30 days to respond.

The comment period for this law ended June 27, and the VA had until July 1 to make final decisions concerning the implementation. At the meeting of the Legion's Veterans Planning and Coordinating Committee June 10-11, here, a VA official assured that all comments would be considered and then seriously, and any changes in the rules governing the means test would be transmitted to all VA centers.
