We delayed the newsletter a few days due to the Department Convention on June 27 to June 31.

The newly elected Department officers for the year 1996-1997 are:

Commander - Jack Tarpey; Sr Vice Comdr - Doug Woodell; Jr Vice Comdr - Steve Dillion, Harold "Red" Caldwell, Rick Padilla, Naamon Owens, B. J. Runghel, and Dave McConnell. Finance Officer - Stan Hanson; Chaplain - Gary Moody; Historian - Ann Foster; and Sgt at Arms - Dennis Kraft.

The very important issues discussed are:

1. This is an election year and, in view of the trend by the Federal Government, i.e., President and Congress' cutback in Veterans' benefits, we must be informed voters and vote for those candidates who have shown interest in protecting our benefits. All of you who have been reluctant to vote in past elections be sure to get down and vote in this year's election. "The best bet is to elect a Vet."

2. Mr. Murphy has an amendment on the ballot to tax non-profit organizations

such as the American Legion, V.F.W., DAV and others. This amendment, if it should pass, would cause some posts to close their doors and others would be affected greatly. Many programs would be cut back or discontinued completely, such as Boys State, American Legion baseball, oratorical contests, Ft Lyon and many others. So it is very important that we get out and vote this amendment down.

The planning for the Post Home is going very well. We have obtained the approval from the zoning commission, the neighborhood association, and it has passed the first reading of the City Council, with the second reading to be July 9th. The architect has been busy drafting the detailed construction plans and when that is complete, we will be able to have the General Contractor (Al Cyriaque) get estimates from the sub-contractors for the cost of construction. We can then go to the lending agency and apply for financing. If all goes well, we could start construction perhaps as early as September or October with completion around February 1997. If you have not been attending meetings lately, now is the time to start so you can be in on the planning and activities of our new Post Home.

Our next meeting will be July 18 at the DAV Post located on Palmer Park Blvd and Peterson Road. Potluck dinner at 6:00 with the meeting starting at 7:00 P.M.

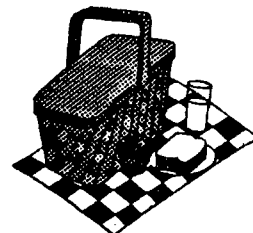
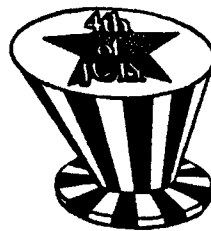

* The National colors should be raised and lowered by hand. Do not raise the flag while it is furled. Unfurl, then hoist quickly to the top of the staff. Lower it slowly and with dignity.

* It is the universal custom to display the flag only from sunrise to sunset. However, the flag may be displayed 24 hours a day if properly illuminated during darkness.

* The flag should not be displayed during inclement weather, except when an all-weather flag is displayed.

* Take every precaution to prevent the flag from becoming soiled. It should not touch the ground or floor or brush against objects.

* When carried, the flag should always be aloft and free, never flat or horizontal.

* The flag should not be dipped to any person or thing, with one exception — Navy vessels, upon receiving a salute of this type from a vessel registered by a nation formally recognized by the United States, must return the courtesy.

* When displayed from a staff in a church or public auditorium, the flag should be in front of the audience and at the speaker's right as he faces the audience, with other flags to his left.

* The flag should never be displayed upside down, except as a signal of distress.

* Do not use the flag as a portion of a costume or athletic equipment.

* Place no objects on or over the flag.

* Never use the flag as drapery or to cover a speaker's platform.

* No other flag may be flown above the Stars and Stripes, except the United Nations flag at U.N. Headquarters, or a church pennant during church services conducted by chaplains at sea.

* When the American flag becomes tattered and torn, or too soiled to clean, it should be destroyed by burning, not dumped in the trash. (American Forces Information Service)
