Holiday Toy Distribution allows kids who are cash challenged to pick out a toy for the sisters and brothers and maybe something for Mom and Dad.

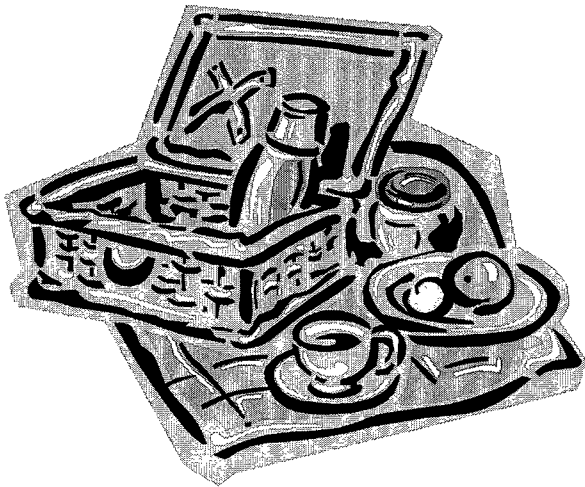
