POW/MIA OBSERVANCE SET FOR MID-SEPTEMBER

Washington (ALNS) -- The national observance of POW/MIA Recognition Day will be September 19, 1986, this year, rather than in Mid-July as in previous years. The change in dates came at the request of individuals and organization to help ensure that more Pow/MIA families could attend ceremonies in there respective home states.

Members of the National League of Families, veterans organizations, and concerned citizens are arranging activities for POW/MIA Recognition Week, September 14 - 19, in each state.

"We hope to increase responsible, Nationwide awareness on the POW/MIA issue," said Ann Mills Griffiths, executive director of the National League of Families, at its office here. "Increased public interest has helped to set the climate for high level negotiations with the Vietnamese and Lao governments."

Griffiths said that joint efforts of veterans organizations, POW/MIA groups, civic associations, family members, and concerned individuals are the most effective signal.

"Futher unified efforts show the Indochinese governments that the families, veterans, and the American people fully support the President's efforts to return our missing men - alive and dead from the Vietnam, Laos, and Cambodia."

The National League of families is the coordination point for Recognition Day activities which can include ballon releases, POW/MIA Races for freedom, and special ceremonies to honor missing Americans and return POWs from all wars. The events do not have to be eleborate to be effective, Griffiths emphasized.

VA ESTABLISHES MEANS TEST FOR HEALTH CARE SERVICES:

Washington (ALNS) -- Congress and the Veteran's Administration have changed the way medical care is provided to veterans who turn to the VA to take care of their health needs.

Effecitive 1 July 1986, a Means Test began to be applied to many veterans who go to VA facilities, but who do not have a service-connected disability. Under the Law, which the American Legion vigorously opposed, non-service-connected disabled veterans must verify that their income is below a certain level. The VA will categorize veterans as one of three types.

Category A: Veterans are not subject to an eligibilaty assessment. That is, either through service-connected disability or through a number of other criteria a veteran will be eligible for care as before the regulations were enacted. Non-service-connected veterans with incomes of \$15,000 or less if single, or \$18,000 or less, if married, plus \$1,000 for each dependent, will also be elibible for care under this category.

Category B: Are veterans who are non-service-connected disabled and who incomes are above \$15,000 but less that \$20,000 if single, or between \$18,000 and \$25,000 if married, plus \$1,000 for each dependent. In this category, the VA may provide care if space is available.

Category C: Are non-service connected veterans whose income is between \$20,000 (if single) and \$25,000 plus \$1,000 for each dependent. Veterans in this category must agree to pay a deductable equal to what is paid under Medicare, currently \$492.00. The VA may provide care if space is available.

Veterans in Category C who receive care will pay the cost of the care of the \$492.00 deductable, whichever is less for the first 90 days of care during any 365 day period. For each additional 90 days, veterans in this category will pay half of the Medicare deductable, with a limit of \$1,476.00 for hospital visits.

For nursing home care the entire deductable is paid for each 90 days of treatment, and outpatient care will cost 20 percent of the VA outpatient billing rate, which comes to \$16.00 per visit.

Total income under the eligibality guidelines includes Social Security, Supplemental Security Income (SSI), U.S. Civil Service retirement, railroad retirement, military retirement, unemployment compensation, total wages from all employers, interest and dividend income, workmen's compensation, Black lung benefits, any other gross income for the calendar year prior to an application for VA care.

The income of spouses and other dependents is also counted. According to the VA, no proof of income will be required, other than completing the requisite forms the VA will provide.

VETERANS NOT SUBJECT TO VA INCOME CRITERIA:

Veterans who are service-connected Disabled. Former Prisoners of War

Veterans who were exposed to herbicides while seriving in Vietnam or to ionizing radiation during the occupation of Hiroshima and Nagasaki or during atmospheric tests, and who are receiving treatments related to that exposure.

Veterans receiving VA pensions

Veterans of the Spanish-American War, The Mexican Border Period, or World War I.

Veterans elibible for medicaid.

The income limits apply to all other non-service-connected disabled veterans, regardless of age.

VA HOME LOANS AIMED AT RECORD YEAR:

The Veterans Administrations Home Loan program spurred by favorable market conditions and low interest rates, is poised for a record-setting year.

VA Administrator Thomas K. Turnage said the popular mortgage guaranty program is running at a pace that will probably exceed \$35 Billion in loan commitments by the end of fiscal year 1986, two months from now. That level, Turnage said, would be the largest dollar volume of loan guaranteed in the program's 42-year history.

With VA guaranteed fixed rate mortgages now at $9\frac{1}{2}$ percent, the lowest in seven years, the agency has experienced extraordinary demands for both new and refinanced loans, Qualified veterans can use their entitlement to purchase, construct, alter, improve, repair or refinance conventional homes, condominiums, and manufactured housing. Loans are made by private lenders, and VA-backing frequently allows veterans to obtain mortgages with little or no down payment.

VA loan guaranty officials said the current level of market activity is being felt throughtout the mortgage and housing industry. Processing backlogs are not unique to VA. the officials noted.

Turnage urged veterans to apply early and plan accordingly. "These favorable conditions have boosted home-buying and financing activity all across America," Turnage said. The VA is a significant part of this truly positive economic news," he added.

COMBATTING ILLITERCY A "PLUS" FOR POSTS:

American Legion Posts have a vital part in a national program to combat adult illitercy in America. Project Literacy U.S. (PLUS) is an unprecedented collaboration between American Broadcasting Companies Inc (ABC) and Public Broadcasting Service (PBS) to address this problem. Studies indicate there are 58 million Americans who are either functionally illiterate or semi-illiteate.

The purpose of Project PLUS is to heighten the awareness of the problem and to seek remedies in the local community.

At present there are 311 local PLUS task forces across the nation in various stages of organization.

At its meeting in May, the National Executive Committee gave the American Legions support for this program through the adoption of a resolution to encourage post to provide program information to their members and the community as National and local programming is developed and announced by ABC and PBS. The following describes the programs currently scheduled by ABC and PBS:

Sept 3 - 10;00 p.m. (EDT) - ABC News documentary -- At a loss for Words: Illiterate in America.

Sept 7 - "This Week with David Brinkley" will address the problem of adult illiteracy.

Sept 8-12 - "ABC World News Tonight" will air a multipart series as a special assignment.

Sept 17 - 8:00 p.m. (EDT) - PBS will air its documentary on adult illitercy.

"ABC News Nightline" and "20/20" will cover this topic during their September programming on dates to be announced later.

In addition, public service announcements are being developed for broadcast from Septmenber through next May. Featuring experiences of adult learners. Other programming, including those geared for childres, are being developed for broadcast.

Naturally, any of these mentioned broadcasts may be delayed by world events that require coverage.

NOTE: As mentioned this is of national interested and is supported by the American Legion. As schedules are released and information is received I will publish it in this newsletter.
